

Thursday: Lecturers To Open Summer Sessions

Outstanding guest lecturers will be a special feature of the University Summer Sessions opening Thursday.

More than 3000 students are expected to register for the four, six and eight week sessions. Registration was held Wednesday.

Heading the list of guest lecturers are speakers for the National Affairs Preview and the World Affairs Preview.

Herbert Prochnow, deputy under-secretary of state for economic affairs, will speak at the National Affairs Preview to be held Monday, June 15. Frank Porter Graham, United Nations representative for India and Pakistan, will be the speaker at the World Affairs Preview on July 9.

Jerome Nathanson, chairman of the board of leaders of the New York Society for Ethical Culture, will be the lecturer for the Clinic on Religion and Public Education scheduled for Thursday, June 21.

Special emphasis will be placed on air age education during the last two weeks in June. The guest speakers and dates of their lectures are: George Gardner, education director, Pan American World Airways, (Monday, June 18); Ray Mertes, director of school and college services, United Air

Lines, (Tuesday, June 26); and John Furbay, director of air world education, Trans World Airways, (Thursday, June 28).

Two clinics on visual education have been scheduled for the Motion Picture Association of America, will be on the campus for lectures Tuesday, July 3.

Maurice B. Mitchell, president of Encyclopedia Britannica Films, Inc., will be here from July 11 to 13.

Walter Cocking, editor of the School Executive, will take part in the Nebraska Community Education Conference to be held the last week in June. He is a former member of the science advisory committee of the National Resources Planning Board.

Science education in the elementary school will be emphasized at a two-day meeting, July 19 to 21. Speaker will be Gerald Craig, professor of secondary education at Columbia University Teachers College.

Two former Nebraskans, Wayne Reed and Royce Knapp, will speak at conferences in July.

Reed, assistant commissioner of education for the U.S. Office of Education, will speak at the Teachers College Conference July 11 and 12.
