

Star Of Week:

Berguin, Brown Nominated

Performances from the football game last Saturday against Iowa State show that it is almost impossible to select only one star of the week so the Nebraskan Sports Staff selects two instead of just one for this honor.

They are: **Walt Blore** and **Bob Berguin**.

Berguin, a senior from Sioux Falls, South Dakota,

played the best game of his career against the Cyclones according to coach Pete Elliott.

He was outstanding on defense and was in on the all important recovery of the Iowa State fumble which gave Nebraska an opportunity for their field goal.

Berguin is a two-year letterman and this year is one of three co-captains on the Husker squad.

Always in top notch physical condition Berguin played 176 minutes in 1955. He stands 6'0" and weighs about 195 pounds.

At Washington High School in Sioux Falls Berguin gained All-State and All-America high school honors in his senior year.

Brown, the hard running fullback from Minden, also played his

best college game according to Elliott. The 5'11" junior gained 121 yards in 11 carries against the Cyclones.

This makes him the top Husker ground gainer of the season so far.

Included in the 121 yards was a 71 yard touch down run early in the second period which pulled the Huskers up to only a 7-6 deficit.

He ran hard throughout the contest although he had to be taken

out a couple of times with minor injuries. Brown also is a stand-out on defense for the Huskers.

Last year as a sophomore Brown started at fullback and when Jim Murphy was injured he volunteered to move to guard. The coaches were happy to have him at this position and he played 202 minutes.

Brown was a very hard runner also during his Minden High School
