

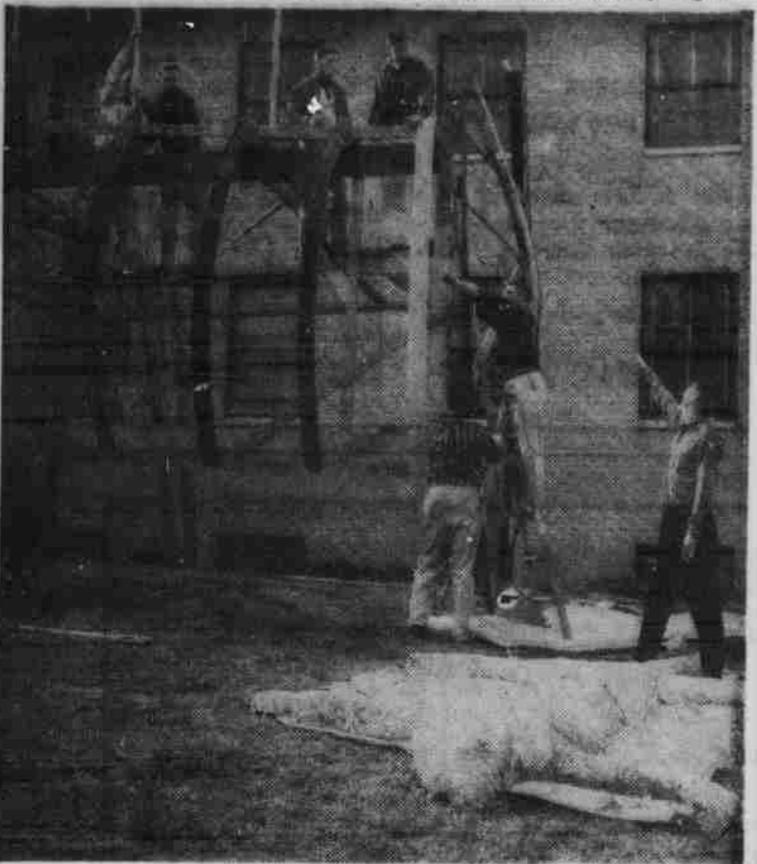

Jensen, editor of the Nebraskan, will speak on Responsibilities and Freedom of College Newspapers and Madsen, business manager of the Nebraskan, will speak on General Business Problems.

This is the second year NU students have made the trip, which is approved by the University board of student publications.

He was also the featured artist in a movie short on modern jazz with narration by Stan Kenton.

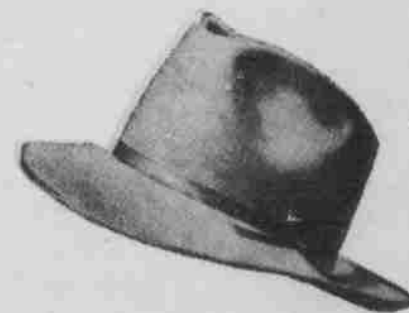

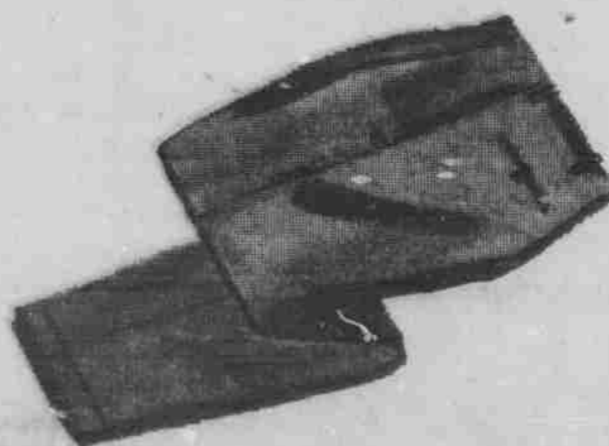
