Dr. Harrison Ray Anderson, pastor of Chicago's Fourth Presbyterian Church, will be the speaker at a college night lecture and coffee hour Wednesday at 7:30 p.m. at the Westminster Presbyterian Church.

Presentation To Highlight Theta Sigma Phi Banquet

Presentation of eight awards to outstanding women journalists in Nebraska will highlight the 1957 Matrix Banquet sponsored by Theta Sigma Phi, Women's professional journalism fraternity at the University, according to Bev Deepe, president. The banquet will be held Saturday, April 6.

Plans to honor Nebraska's women journalists at the 1957 banquet were announced Thursday by Miss Deepe.

"Our desire is to focus attention on the contribution being made by Nebraska newspaperwomen and in so doing to encourage more girls to consider journalism as a career," Miss Deepe said.


Editors and publishers throughout Nebraska are being requested to nominate top women staff members who will submit samples of their work in one of three writing categories for judging—spot news, feature stories and women's page stories of columns, Miss Deepe stated.

Scrolls will be presented to winners in each of the three categories in both daily and weekly newspaper divisions, Miss Deepe said. From the list of category winners, two women will be chosen to receive "Journalist of the Year" plaques; one for the daily field; the other, for the weekly field.

Deadline for contestants to submit entries is Friday, March 15, according to Miss Deepe. All entries should be mailed to Woman of the Year Contest, Theta Sigma Phi, School of Journalism, University of Nebraska.
