Debate rounds begin at 1:30 p.m. Friday. The first round will be held in sorority and fraternity houses, since there are not enough free rooms on campus at that hours, according to Olson.

The second round begins at 3 p.m., the third at 4:30 p.m. Two additional rounds are scheduled for Saturday at 8 and 9:30 p.m.

The question for debate is "Resolved that the United States should discontinue direct economic aid to foreign nations."
