Epstein: Defense Procedure Posted For All-Out Atomic Attack

(This is the third in a series of articles presented by the University Red Cross Unit).
Procedure in case of an all-out attack on the Lincoln area has been announced by Larry Epstein, Red Cross president.

In case of an attack the students will be notified by a five minute steady blast of Civil Defense sirens.

The campus is divided into two routes. This west of 14th Street will travel three miles north on 14th to Superior Avenue and turn west to Highway 2 and 24 to Utica and Beaver Crossing. Students located east of 14th street should go out O street to Friend, Exeter, Fairmont and York.

Anyone without transportation should walk to the nearest evacuation center where they will be picked up by the available transportation. Students driving cars should load them to the fullest capacity and join the traffic flow to the nearest evacuation route.
Gas tanks should be at least half full. If a vehicle breaks down, it
