**Regents Laud Hardin For Fine  
Job Of Keeping Faculty Intact**

The Board of Regents Saturday commended Chancellor Clifford Hardin for his "outstanding record at the University."

Dr. B. N. Greenberg, president, stated "It is a matter of knowledge to this Board that Chancellor Hardin has done an excellent job in the sometimes hopeless task of keeping a fine faculty intact."

"He has done an excellent job of translating the needs of the University to the governor and the members of the legislature."

In other action the Regents approved the appointment of Dr. Clayton Gerken, director of the counseling service at the University of Iowa, to a similar post at the University.

Dr. Gerken's title will be director of counseling and professor psychology and educational psychology, effective Sept. 1.

He is a consultant of the American Board of Physical Medicine and Rehabilitation at Rochester, Minn. and Chicago and visiting consultant for the Veterans Hospital at Knoxville, Ia.

James Hassler, assistant agriculture economist at the University of California, was appointed assistant professor of agriculture economics.

The Regents accepted these resignations:

Harold Chapman, associate professor of horticulture, who has accepted a similar position at Colorado State College. He has been a staff member since 1946.

Milo Cox, assistant professor and assistant agronomist, who has accepted a post with the International Cooperation Administration in Chile. He has been a faculty member since 1955.

Robert Kozelka, assistant professor of mathematics and astron-

omy, who has accepted a similar position at the University of Virginia.

The Regents approved the following leaves of absence:

Dr. Thomas Raysor, professor of English, for one year, to accept a Frank Woods Fellowship.

Robert Morgan, associate professor of political science, who will be the visiting professor at the University of Virginia.

Gilbert Sechrist, as professor of electrical engineering; he has been a staff member since 1947.

Florence Corbin, associate professor of vocational education homemaking, 31 years of service.
