Educational Television Workshop Planned

A workshop for in-school teaching by television will be held at the University from June 17 to 28, according to Niels Wodder, supervisor.

The workshop is in part financed by the National Association of Educational Broadcasters, according to Wodder.

The workshop will analyze the proper role of educational television, instruct supervisors from small supervisors from small high schools in the methods utilizing the facilities and develop guides to follow during the teaching year, he said.

The television correspondence program was made possible by a grant of \$155,050 from the Fund for the Advancement of Education.

The first week of the workshop by guest speakers and workshop resource personnel, according to Wodder.

The staff and faculty of the University and the State Department of Education, the staff of the University station KUON-TV, the teachers of television courses and the staffs of schools participating

in last year's programs will provide instruction.

During the second week, participants will receive special orientation by the same people concerning the duties of the supervisor in the television-correspondence classroom.

There will be a special session held to develop an understanding teaching method, Wodder said.

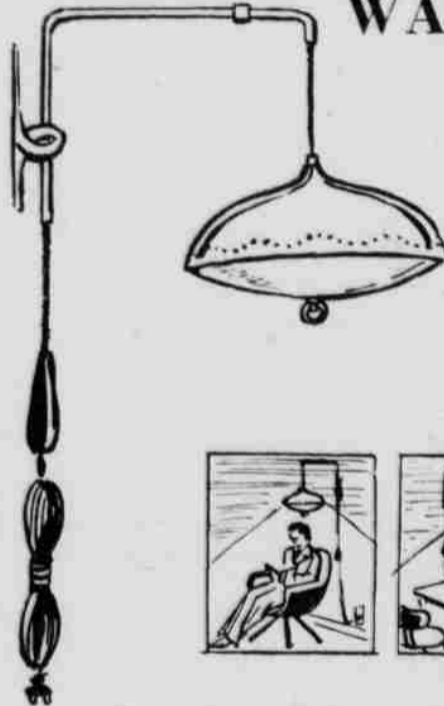
