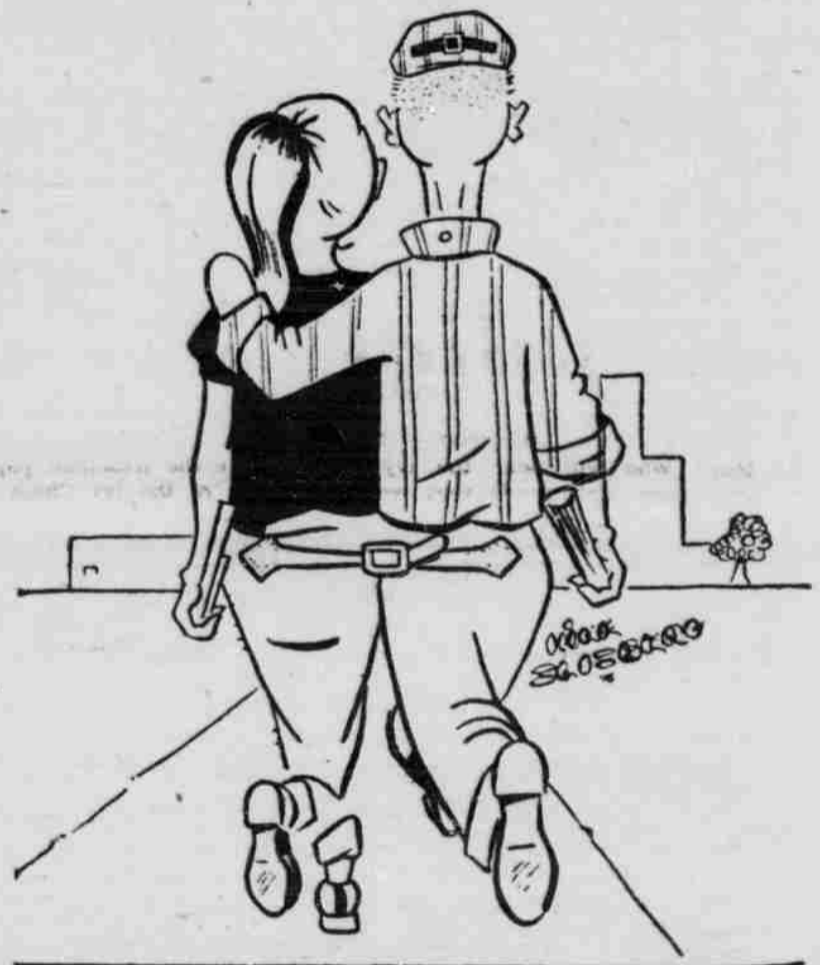
University life is, of course, an experience apart from and in your life. But foremost you will gain from it the realization of how much there is to know and how inadequate we are to learn the myriad secrets of life.
