

Student Affairs Explained By Colbert

The following is a message to the new students from J. P. Colbert, Dean of the Division of Student Affairs:

"A modern college or university consists of three major parts: the campus, the faculty, and the student body. Take away any one of these parts and the university ceases to exist.

"Because there would be no university if there were no students, the Board of Regents of the University of Nebraska has designated that there shall be a Division of Student Affairs concerned with the scholastic progress and general welfare of the student body. Therefore, this Division is interested in students from the time they enter the University until they graduate.

"We assist entering students in their search for suitable housing. We assist those students, who must earn part or all of their college expenses, to find part-time local employment. Our Junior Division and Counseling Service, which is within the Division of Student Affairs, is charged with administering the scholastic programs of all freshman students. In other words, all freshmen enter the University through the Junior Division. May I refer you to another item in this issue of The Daily Nebraskan written by Mr. Chatfield, Director of the Junior Division and Counseling Service, which explains the functions of that Division.

"The Bureau of Instructional Research, which is also within the

Division of Student Affairs, assists the Junior Division and Counseling Service by giving aptitude and proficiency tests to students. The Bureau also is in charge of the testing program connected with the awarding of University scholarships.

The Division of Student Affairs assists the student body with its activities and social affairs by maintaining an Events Calendar. Without such a calendar there would be in a school of this size too many conflicting activities and events. The Division and the Student Council, working together, assist new student organizations to get started and keep track of existing organizations.

"Because normal progress through the University is measured by grades and credits earned, the scholastic progress of all students is very important. Although any person who graduates from an accredited high school in the State is eligible to enter the University, he must make normal progress semester by semester in order to remain in school. The Division of Student Affairs is charged with the duty of keeping track of the scholastic progress of all students. Again may I refer you to another item in this issue written by Mr. Fowles, Assistant Dean in the Division of Student Affairs. Dean Fowles explains the requirements of normal scholastic progress.

"When a student nears the end of his collegiate career, he begins to think about his first job following graduation. The Division of Student Affairs maintains an active Occupational Placement Service to assist graduating seniors make contact with representatives from business and industry who are looking for college graduates.

Chatfield Depicts Counseling Service

The following is a message from Lee Chatfield, Director of the Junior Division and the Counseling Service:

"Can we help you? That is the question that states the reason for our existence. The Junior Division and Counseling Service was created to help students in their efforts to be more effective in their college program.

"The Junior Division is here to help you get started with your college career. We try to help you understand the difference between high school and college. We try to help you find out about the great number of opportunities that are available to you for educational and personal development. "The Counseling Service is not limited to Junior Division students. Its function is to serve all students, without regard to class or status.

Several of the colleges also maintain similar services and work closely with the Division in this important service to our students.

"The above is but a thumbnail sketch of the many activities and responsibilities of the Division of Student Affairs. The Division offices are in Ellen Smith Hall at 14th and R Streets. If you want information or need assistance, come in. We are here to serve you."

Hallgren Describes Special Functions

The following message about the Division of Student Affairs is from F. M. Hallgren, dean of men:

"One of the specialized functions of the Division of Student Affairs is to assist students in student activities and student organizations. Certain requirements are set by the University Senate for participation in extra-curricular activities. The enforcement of these rules is the responsibility of the Division of Student Affairs. Like-wise certain principles have been set for the operation of student organizations. If you have any questions concerning student activities or student organizations the staff will be very happy to discuss them with you.

"Another function of the Division of Student Affairs is to encourage students to maintain high standards of personal as well as group conduct. The University expects its students and its organizations to conduct themselves according to the very best standards of a well-ordered society. It is assumed that all students will be familiar with the rules of the University and the laws of the State. Conformity to rules and laws is not the goal of student conduct, however, conformity is the minimum acceptable standard. Students are encouraged to set much higher standards for themselves. It is the responsibility of the Division of Student Affairs to discipline students who violate the standards of acceptable conduct. If you have any questions concerning student conduct, the staff will be very happy to discuss them with you.
