A student needs to take this test once during his college years. It will be give on Satuurday, March 1, from 8:30 a.m. to noon. The score from this test is combined with the grade average to determine a relative rating.

5. The student must be worthy of financial assistance. Financial need is an important consideration in many of the scholarships. Even when financial need has been established, the applicant must show by his academic progress and by high scholastic achievement.


