### 'School Life' Scholarships Announced

The Faculty Women's Club has announced three senior scholarships, two of \$150 and one of \$100, to be granted in recognition of meritorious efforts in school life as well as for scholastic attainment.

Any woman student who has sufficient hours to be graduated in June 1959 or at the end of the summer session of 1959 and is wholly or partially self-supporting is eligible to apply for these scholarships.

Candidates may secure application blanks from the Division of Student Affairs, the School of Nursing Office in Omaha or 114 Home Economics Building on Ag campus. Applications must be mailed to Mrs. Raymond Dein, 1916 Dakota Street, by March 1.

Applicants will meet with the scholarship committee for personal interviews in the Union faculty lounge from 1 p.m. to 4 p.m. on March 15.

A second aid to students is the Memorial Student Aid Fund which offers financial assistance to students in varying amounts, depending on the need. Men or women who are recommended by two faculty members are eligible. Applications for this aid may be made through the Division of Student Affairs office.

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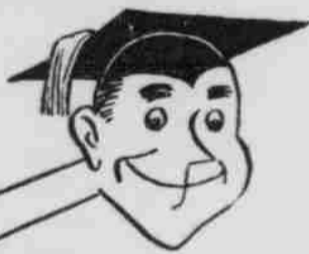
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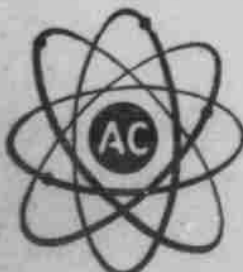
