

# Dauntless Seven Awarded Star For Kansas Victory

Roundballers Edge Gardner, Bucklin, Young In Week Crowded With Husker Standouts

Nebraska's battling Cornhusker basketball team wins this week's Star of the Week award in a neck and neck chase with Keith Gardner, Ron Bucklin and Keith Young.

It had to be coach Jerry Bush's fabulous seven in spite of Gardner's world record, Bucklin's two wins in a smashing NU swimming meet victory and Young's consistency in the hurdles and dash.

For who could match the sheer drama of Nebraska's 43-41 victory over Kansas? And as Bush himself said Tuesday, "Who could match the seven men who won the victory—at least, who could match them on the night of February 22?"

After the contest, Bush had a good word for each of his players. A brief review of their contributions is in order as a foundation for the award.

Captain Gary Reimers led the Husker scoring with 14 points. Reimers, however, was more than the scoring leader. His ball handling, dribbling and floor leadership had the crowd cheering several times. When leg cramps forced him to leave briefly late in the

game, he got a standing ovation for his work.

Herschel Turner was Nebraska's leading rebounder with seven. Time after time, he bewildered the Kansas defense with ball handling antics, and his driving style of play netted him 12 points. So poised was his play, that it was hard to believe he is only a sophomore.

Don Smidt was Nebraska's defensive ace. The lanky senior also put on dribbling and ball handling exhibition that often had Kansas defense men reaching for nothing. His work was a prime factor in shackling Wilt Chamberlain.

Willie Fitzpatrick added his typically cool, steady brand of ball and worked well with Turner on several offensive plays that brought the crowd to its feet.

Bob Harry, teamed with Smidt to defend against Chamberlain and handled the ball like a seasoned veteran in spite of the fact that as a sophomore, he has started only five times.

Jim Arwood got out of a sickbed where he spent the

week fighting the flu, and substituted beautifully when Reimers had to leave the game.

Jim Kubacki suited up in the last six minutes of play and then came off the bench to score the winning basket.

## Cyclones Use Husker Tactics, Chill Kansas In Second Straight Upset

The Iowa State Cyclones defeated Kansas 40-42 in a rugged Big Eight Conference basketball game Monday night. The Cyclones held Wilt Chamberlain to 26 points. The Kansas defeat assured Kansas State of at least a tie for the Big Eight championship.

This was the second straight defeat for the Jayhawks. Nebraska squeezed by Kansas 43-41 Saturday night. The defeat was the worst for Kansas since Chamberlain, the fabulous 7-footer from Philadelphia, joined Coach Dick Harp's team on the Kaw River. The previous seven defeats Kansas had suffered were in overtimes or by last-second baskets.

The Cyclones, using a zone defense and at times using three men to guard Chamberlain, prevented the giant

from getting many good shots away.

Wilt was out-rebounded 11 to 8 by Iowa State's John Crawford.

The victory was Iowa State's fifth in the loop against four defeats. The loss was Kansas' fourth in the Big Eight compared with six victories.

Although the Jayhawks' made a greater percent of

their shots, Iowa State cashed in on their free throws.

Each team garnered 22 rebounds.

A capacity crowd of 7,800 was on hand for the contest. Cyclone fans, thrilled at the upset, hoisted players on their shoulders following the game and tore down both nets.
