Jennings Corral Three Stars Prep Threats To Attend NU

Bill Jennings, Husker head football coach, announced Wednesday that three more high school grid stars are in the NU football fold.

Ken Dostal, Scribner tackle, Warren Doby, Scuyler tackle, and Larry Blum, Seward fullback are the prepsters who have announced they will attend the University next year.

Dostal tips the scales at 215 and stands 6'3". He is a three year veteran of both football and basketball and was a World Herald all-state selection at tackle in Class C last fall.

Doby stands 6'2" and weighs in at 195. He was the star of a Scuyler team that finished high in the Class B ratings last fall, and his season's play also earned him a World Herald all-state certificate.

Nebraska's track squad left Thursday noon for the Big Eight indoor track meet in Kansas City. The Huskers will be going into the meet as the Daily Nebraskan's pick to unseat Kansas as conference indoor champion. Coach Frank Sevine will have the incredible Keith Gardner to call on for points in the hurdles and 60 yd. dash as well as his running mate, Keith Young. Gardner is unbeaten in all three races this year and only once has Young failed to finish second.

Not only can Nebraska count on points from Gardner, but Joe Mullins, their sophomore miler, should place in the mile and half mile if he runs. Mullins' status is not clear due to a bone spur in his instep. However, there is still Knolly Barnes and Mike Flemming in the long races, maybe.

In the field, Husker captain Bill Hawkins will be in the money in the broad jump while Husker vaulter Ken Pollard might drag down a place in the vault. If you notice a slight tinge of conservatism in the above, I hope that's because it is there. At no place have I predicted a Nebraskan will finish first in anything and the frequent use of the words should and might also indicate doubt.

The reason is of course, that this year's conference track meet will call together the most outstanding college talent in the nation in some events. A young man named Tidwell from Kansas has run the 60 in :06 flat, good enough to tie the world record. It could be Tidwell that pins the first defeat of the year on Gardner.

Not only that, but Gardner's pet races, the hurdles, may not be his to take. Kansas has another lad, name of Shelby, who could sneak up and take it all in the lows. There is also no guarantee that Gardner will be able to hold off Eddie Dove for a second time. I saw Keith in the fieldhouse the other day and asked him how he thought he would do at Kansas City. He replied that "this could be a weekend of lamentations if I'm not ready for them."

There is no doubt that Gardner will be trained to a very peak of condition, but I have heard no rumors that any of his opponents have been doing otherwise themselves. Another thing to remember is that Nebraska has depended heavily on the pole vault for points in their dual meets. The Huskers still have a good

Herschell Turner, 6-2 sophomore from Indianapolis, Ind., moved into second place in team scoring with 230 pts. Turner leads the Husker team in rebounds with 172. The steadily improving hustler is closing in on Capt. Gary Reimer's scoring lead of 240.

Willie Fitzpatrick, previously the second high scorer dropped to third with a 229 total. Willie is second in team rebounds with 141 followed by Don Smidt who has 126 rebounds.

The Huskers, who have been exceptionally tough on the home court, will face league leading Kansas State on Monday.

Monday's game against Kansas State will be preceded by a mammoth rally beginning at 4:30 p.m. Chancellor Hardin, Coach Bush, and the Basketball team led by Capt. Reimers will be present at the rally.

The assembly place for the rally will be the Carrillon Tower with the Union as the final destination.
