Jayhawks Capture Seventh Title With Distance Power

Gardner, Young Star In Short Races, Pollard Takes Third With Best Career Mark

If they had just kept running short races at Kansas City Saturday night, Nebraska's Cornhuskers might have been the new Big Eight indoor track champions.

Nebraska collected 23 points in the two 60 yd. hurdles races and the 60 yd. dash, to lead Kansas by a handy 10 points with four events completed. Keith Gardner and Keith Young accounted for 22 of these points between them as Gardner won the lows in 06.7,

tying his own world record, and the highs with :07.2, again tying a world mark.

Distance Strength

However, Kansas' strength in the distance races began to pay off and the Jayhawks pulled away to a 58 5/6 to 35 1/6 win. It was the seventh straight title for the Kansans, but the second place finish marked a steady improvement by Nebraska which may yet threaten the Jayhawk's dynasty. As Husker coach Frank Sevigne put it after the points were all totaled, "We still have the outdoor this spring."

Even though Kansas won the overall title, it was Nebraska's two great individual performers, Gardner and Young, who stole the show from their victorious rivals. Young collected nine points with a second in the high hurdles, a fourth in the 60 yd. dash, and a third in the lows. Gardner missed a fourth triple crown and an unbeaten indoor season when he was one stride short of Oklahoma's Dee Givens in the 60. Gardner had set a new Big Eight record in that event with a qualifying time of :06.1 Friday, and Givens had to tie that to beat the Jamaican and Kansas Charlie Tidwell, who finished second.

Gardner said after the race, "That was the worst start I

got all year. It took me 30 yards to get swinging right and I just couldn't do it then."

More Heroics

As if that were not enough heroics for one meet, Keith also undertook a leg of the mile relay. There he thrilled the crowd by turning a five yard deficit into a 25 yard Husker lead. In spite of Gardner's great quarter, Nebraska lost the relay to Kansas State when sophomore Joe Mullins fell just before crossing the finish line. Mullins, obviously bothered by a sore foot, was beaten by DeLoss Dodds of Kansas State, who did a fine job of whittling the Husker's huge margin.

Pollard Scores

Nebraska also got a great individual performance from vaulter Ken Pollard. Pollard reached a career high of 13' 10 3/4" to tie for third. Several times he brought the crowd up cheering with beautiful vaults. He just missed clearing the barrier at the winning height of 14' 2 3/4" when he brushed the bar with his chest just after his approach had been interrupted when a spectator crossed the runway.

Husker Points

Nebraska collected the remainder of their points when Knolly Barnes finished fourth in the half mile and Bill Hawkins took third in the broad jump. Don Phillips was fifth behind Hawkins in that event and Randy Clark added the 1/6 of a point by tying for fifth in the high jump. Bill Marten's fifth in the high hurdles accounted for the final Husker point.

Sevigne said that he was "proud" of the Nebraska showing. "Kansas just rose to the occasion, and they'll be rough next year too," the Husker mentor concluded.

Tankers Fall At K-State North Top Husker Scorer

Jim Nolan swam the 200 yd. butterfly event in 2:35.5 for a new meet record as the Kansas State Wildcats downed Nebraska, 54-32 in a dual swimming meet at Manhattan Saturday.

Bill North was the top Nebraska point gatherer with a win in the 220 yd. free style and a second in the 440 yd. freestyle. Ron Renfer added a first in the 100 yd. free style and Ron Bucklin scored his second straight victory in the 200 yd. breaststroke.

Nation's No. 1 Team To Defend Record

The nation's No. 1 Basketball team meets Nebraska's red hot Huskers at the Coliseum tonight in what should be the thriller of all thrillers. Tex Winter brings his Kansas State Wildcats who are riding the crest of a 20-1 season record to do battle with the Bushmen.

Cornhusker spirit has hit an all season high with a pregame rally scheduled for 4:30 this afternoon. A large crowd is expected but plenty of seats are still available. Game time is 8:05.

The Huskers, who have a win streak of 3 games now, are not favored to win this one but who can tell. Kansas University handed the Wildcats their only loss of the season by a 79-65 count. Nebraska defeated the Jayhawks 43-41 last week.

Several factors work in the Huskers favor however and for these reasons Nebraska cannot be taken lightly. Cornhusker spirit is at its peak. Team confidence is at its peak. The Wildcats played last Saturday night while the Huskers rested.

Information from Manhattan seems to indicate that the Wildcats are pointing toward the NCAA Regional playoffs against Cincinnati on March 14 & 15. Overconfidence has caused the downfall of a champion more than once.

Nebraska's Willie Fitzpatrick is expected to be in top form after suffering a slight knee injury on Wednesday. The Wildcat's Jack Parr and Hayden Abbott are also nursing minor injuries.
