

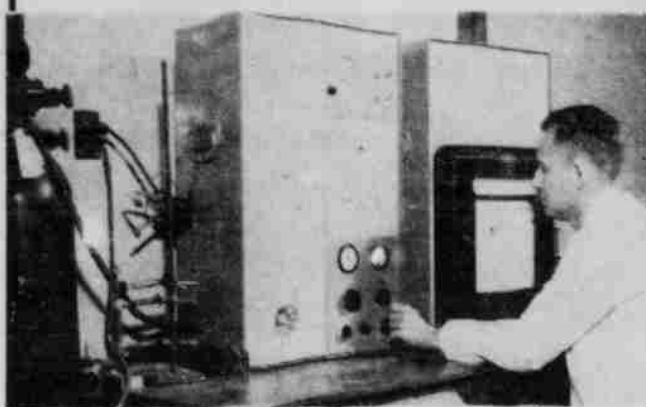
### Kalicos Klick Tonite

### Hardin Joins Overseas Panel

Chancellor Clifford Hardin was named recently to the national advisory panel of the Institute of Research on Overseas Programs at Michigan State University. The Institute, financed by grants from the Carnegie Corporation, is making an extensive study of the effectiveness of overseas programs being conducted by American universities. A major function of the panel, according to Dr. Edward Weidner of Michigan State University, director, will be to help interpret the significance of data being collected throughout the world on American university projects overseas.

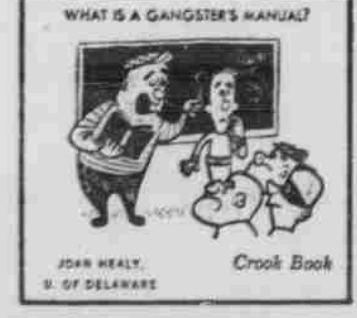
