#### Law Enforcement Adequate

The special investigator hired to study the handling of the Charles Starkweather case, Harold Robinson, has reported that he found the law enforcement adequate with no sign of laxity.

The investigator's findings were outlined in a 43 page report to city and county officials.

#### Woman Masquerades As Man

A dark-haired woman who dressed as a man for several years to escape police has finally been arrested in Raleigh, N.C.

The FBI arrested Geraldine Moore after her fingerprints showed her to be the suspect in the case, previously thought to have been a man.

One time, she was arrested and released under bond without police detecting her disguise.

#### Salt Shaker Explodes

A glass salt shaker, fashioned into a bomb with rocket fuel, exploded and injured four students in a Rutgers University dormitory in New Brunswick, N.J.

The concoction was mixed by the amateur rocketeers, according to police. One of the students had just placed it on the floor when the blast shot bits of glass through the room.

#### Unemployment Still Up

Unemployed is still increasing in March in the nation's major labor markets, according to a spot check by the Associated Press.

Covering more than a dozen of the biggest employment areas, the sample showed the idle in these areas increased by about 150,000 from the middle of February to the middle of March.

#### Poison Clinic Here

Lincoln is being considered as one of the cities for a poison information clinic by state and federal health departments.

The clinic would not be primarily designed for treating individuals who have been poisoned, but as information agencies.

#### Bulgarian May Be Out

Nikolai Bulganin may lose his job as Russian premier this week in the continuing battle for power in the Soviet Union.

His removal would increase the already great authority concentrated in the hands of Nikita Khrushchev, first secretary of the Communist Party.

#### Todd Death Crash Probed

Experts examined bits of wreckage Sunday in an attempt to determine the cause of the plane crash which killed producer Mike Todd and three others.

Todd's wife, actress Elizabeth Taylor, prevented from accompanying him by a virus, was placed under sedatives after learning of her husband's death.

#### Ike's Veto Would Hurt Ag

Lyndon B. Johnson, Senate Democratic Leader, said Sunday veto of a proposed farm price support bill by President Eisenhower would be a "crushing blow to agriculture."

Johnson said the veto would force farm prices down to new lows. While profits in wages in other fields have gone up in the past 6 years, farm income has slumped 20 per cent, he said.

#### McCook Educator Democratic Candidate

Ralph G. Brooks of McCook announced intent to file for governor Sunday. The 59-year-old Democrat is superintendent of McCook schools and president of McCook Junior College.

The stage was set for Brooks' candidacy by withdrawal of two-time Central City gubernatorial candidate, Walter Raelcke.

### Relatively Warm Air To Hit Husker Campus

Get out the picnic baskets folks: it's going to be warm today (relatively).

Highs Monday are expected to reach 45-55, but there may be less sun. Partly cloudy skies are expected and some parts of the western counties will have rain or snow.

Meanwhile Eastern sections of the country continued to dig out from under a last minute sneak attack by winter.

The eastern seaboard was hard hit by a surprise snowstorm which paralyzed traffic and grounded airliners in New York City Saturday.

Seven deaths on the Pennsylvania Turnpike were attributed to the storm, measuring up to ten inches in some spots.

The slated speaker is Dr. H. C. Lueith, former dean of the college of medicine. He is now a member of the council for national defense of the American Medical Association.

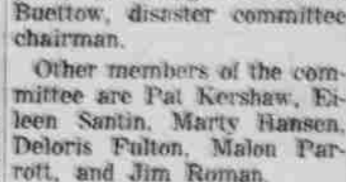
