'Annie' Biggest KK Show

Cost May Reach \$6,000

"It's the biggest show Kosmet Klub has ever presented and the largest amount of staging ever done in the Pershing Municipal Auditorium."

These are the words Dave Meisenholder, set designer and technical director, used to describe Kosmet Klub's production of Irving Berlin's "Annie Get Your Gun," which will be presented May 23 and 24 at 8:30 p.m.

Large Sets
Meisenholder said the sets to be used in the show are the largest both in height and width ever to be used by Kosmet Klub or in the Auditorium.

"The sets are extremely colorful and are designed with suggestive realism to promote the gaiety of the early 1900's. The three largest sets include a circus tent, the ballroom and a mobile train," according to Meisenholder.

All technical work on the show is estimated at a cost of \$1200, Meisenholder said. Total cost of the production may reach nearly \$6000.

The circus tent will cover the entire stage of the Auditorium. Six hundred yards of draping were used in the construction, to be used for Annie's shooting matches, ceremonial Indian dances and to capture the thrill of Buffalo Bill's Wild West Show.

Ballroom Scene
"The ballroom is the only scene in the show where boys and country people people switch to the extreme of 5th Avenue formality. This set also covers the entire stage," Meisenholder said.

The third large set will be a mobile train. The 25-foot dining car is used for the scene in which Annie travels from the backwoods into the glamour of show business.

In addition to Meisenholder, the technical crew is composed of Dale Crutcher, lighting director, and Sue Yates and Bill Welsh, artists.

This year's Kosmet Klub production stars Betty Lester as Annie; Norman Riggins as Frank Butler; Barb Weston as Winnie; Fred Stelling as Tommy; Wayne Robertson as Charlie; Vern Feye, as Mr. Wilson; Dick Gustafson as Buffalo Bill and Roy Wiley as Sitting Bull.

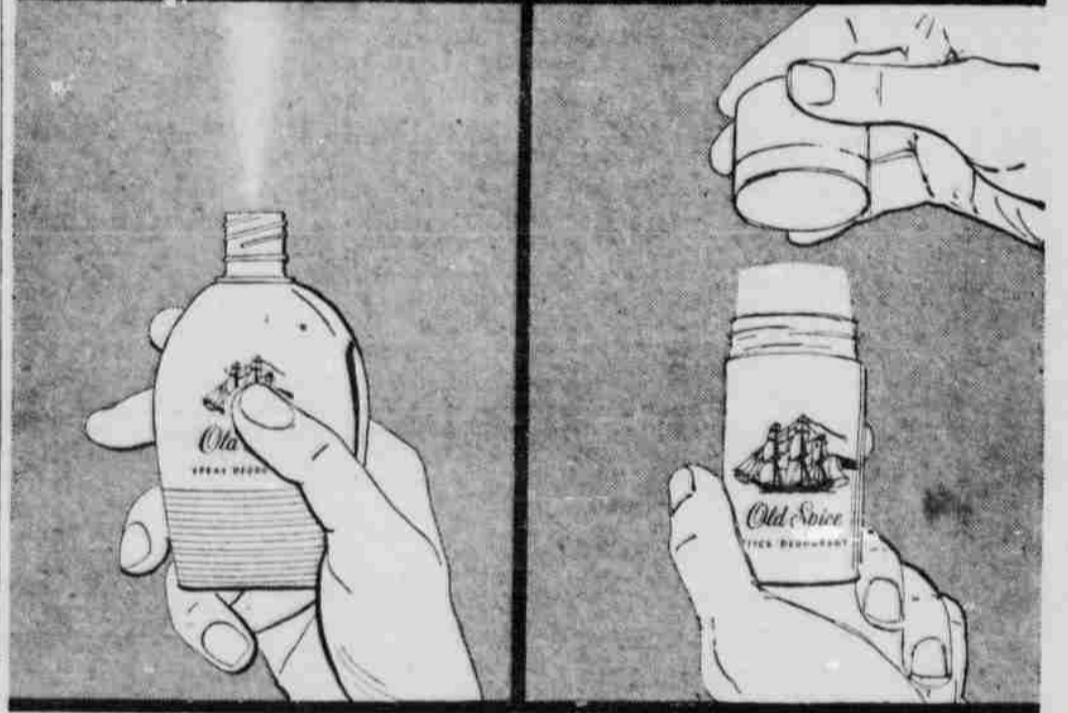
