NU Baseballers Head South For Vital Series

Weak Hitting Cowboys Depend On Flingers; Siebler, Ziegenbein To Face Oklahoma State A

While pacesetter Oklahoma and Missouri tangle for the league lead this afternoon, Nebraska and Oklahoma State will face off at Stillwater, Oklahoma in a crucial series opener that could drop one of them out of contention for the league crown. The Huskers will have their backs against the wall as they take the field against Ron Peterson, ace of the Cowboys' mound staff, Oklahoma State, newest member of the conference, will be after a three game sweep as they battle to regain the conference lead and possibly their first Big Eight crown in any sport.

Cowboys Surprise
Oklahoma State has been one of the big surprises in the conference. They haven't been a hard hitting ball team, but their fine pitching corps have more than compensated for their weakness at the plate. Peterson has been their mound ace, but has received fine support from Ron Soergel, who pitched a five hit win against Kansas last week and Joe Horlien, who lost a two-hitter to Kansas last week. The Cowboys will probably start Peterson Friday

Sooners Lead Loop

Oklahoma University climbed to the top of the tangled Big Eight Conference standings after sweeping a three-game series from Iowa State, the defending champs. The new league leaders were extended to 11 innings before they clipped the Cyclones 11-8 in their first game Friday.

They completed the sweep by taking a Saturday doubleheader 4-2 and 9-1. The triple loss left last year's champions mired in a last place tie with Kansas State with a 7-7 mark. Oklahoma's mark stands at 6-2.

Missouri Second
Trailing the Sooners by half a game are the Missouri Tigers. Missouri will have a chance to take the lead when they play host to they Sooners at Columbia, Mo. The Tigers ran away from Kansas State 24-2, in a single game on Friday. Missouri continued its winning ways by taking the first game of a Saturday doubleheader 5-0. However, the Wildcats gained revenge and knocked Missouri out of the conference lead when they shut out the Tigers 6-0 in the second game.

Cowboys Drop Two
Last week's leaders, Oklahoma State, dropped to third place and a full game off the pace after they were beaten in two out of three games by Kansas. Kansas won a tight nine inning affair on Friday by a 7-6 margin. The two teams split a doubleheader Saturday Kansas won the first game 1-0 and Oklahoma State salvaged the last one 6-0. The wins by the Jayhawks left them in a tie for fourth place with Nebraska. Nebraska stayed in contention by winning two out of three games from Colorado.

Besides the three-game series between the league leaders, Oklahoma and Missouri, Nebraska will travel to Stillwater Oklahoma for a "do or die" series with the Oklahoma State Cowboys. A sweep by either team would drop the losers practically out of conference contention.

Kansas will travel to the Rockies to engage Colorado and the two cellar clubs, Iowa State and Kansas State, will battle in a three game series at Ames Iowa.

Charlie Ziegenbein, who hit his stride last week against Colorado, is on the docket as opening pitcher in the first game Saturday. Last week Ziegenbein held Colorado to

four hits as he posted his fourth win against one loss. The second pitching assignment will fall on the shoulders of either Gil Dunne or Lefty Hevner. Dunne, who had only seen relief action up to last week, was very impressive in his ten-inning stint against Colorado.
