Two Of 41 Plebes Made '58 Average

A motion to make those men in the lower one fourth of their high school class ineligible to pledge the first semester was placed before the IFC Wednesday night.

They would be eligible to pledge second semester if they attained a four average for the first semester.

Report Quoted In supporting his motion vice-president John Glynn quoted from a report by Dwaine Rogge of the IFC scholarship committee which stated the following facts:

Last year out of 41 men pledged from the lower one fourth of their classes, only two made their average the first semester.

Ten of these men made below a two.

Twenty made below a three.

The year before 31 men were pledged from the lower quartile and 1 made his average.
