Odds Favor Huskers

Iowa Coach Optimistic About Outcome

Nebraska will find themselves in the favorite's role for the first time this year when they play host to the undefeated Iowa State Cyclones. About the only thing that makes Nebraska the favorite is the fact that the game is being played on the Huskers' home gridiron. It will be the first Big Eight game for the Huskers and the Cyclones.

Head Coach Iowa State, under their new head coach Clay Stapleton, has met and defeated Drake and Arizona. Stapleton refuses to give Nebraska any edge and has

been optimistic about the Cyclones chances of defeating Nebraska.

Nebraska and Iowa State have been on fairly even terms the past few seasons even though the Cyclones gained their first victory over the Huskers in many years when they whitewashed Nebraska 13-0 at Ames, Ia., year.

Iowa State has always had a rough row to hoe when they've played in Lincoln. Their last win was in 1944 by a 19-6 score. The time before that it was in 1938 and it was an 8-7 margin.

The Huskers will probably see only limited action from Pat Fischer, their prize sophomore scabback, while Iowa State will be without

the full services of tackle Ralph Losee and end Bob Anderson.

More Split-T There is a good chance that Nebraska fans will see more split-T than single wing. Key man in the Huskers split-T attack will probably be George Harshman, who, after a year's lay-off, has shown surprising improvement.

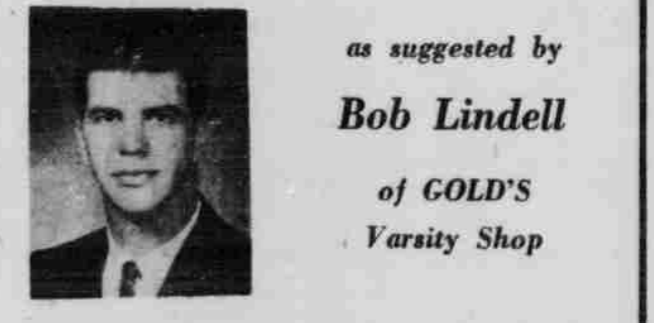

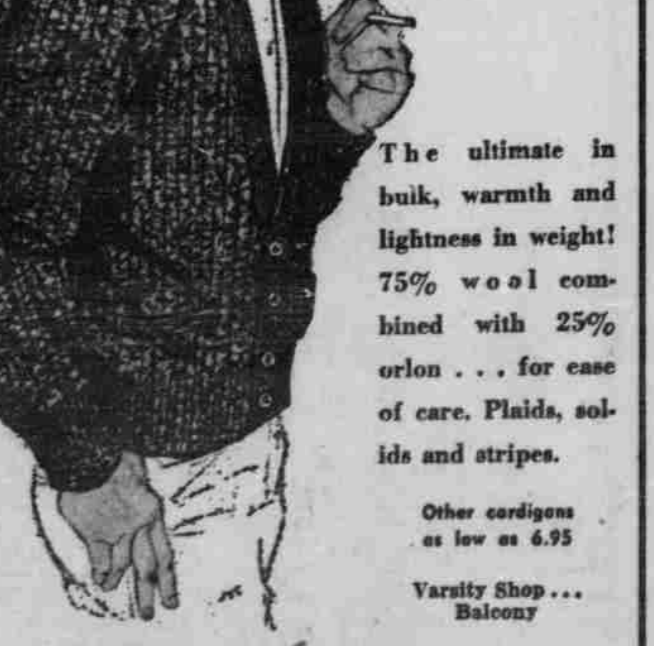
