Prof Attends Biology Meeting

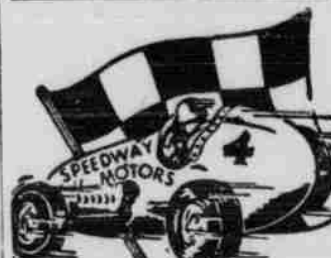
Dr. Dwight Miller, professor of zoology, will participate today and Saturday in a biology conference in Macomb, Ill.
