# Nebraskan Rated 1st Class

## All American Honors Missed

The Daily Nebraskan has been awarded a first class honor rating by the Associated Collegiate Press for the second semester of 1957-58.

The Nebraskan was listed tops among 12 school papers which received this high award. Student papers at Iowa State, Oklahoma State and Kansas State were the only ones in the Big Eight to equal the Nebraskan's rating.

Five papers received All American honor ratings, the highest given, which is just one notch above a first class award. The University of California at Berkeley, Wayne State University at Detroit, the University of Texas, the University of Southern California and the University of Minnesota published these prize-winning papers.

Dick Shugrue was editor of the paper last semester. Ernest Hines was editorial editor and Mack Lundstrom was managing editor. Emmie Limpo was news editor; George Moyer, sports editor; Gary Rodgers, Diana Maxwell, Pat Flannigan, Carroll Kraus and Gretchen Sides were copy editors. Jerry Selentini was business manager. Neal Stanford, correspondent for The Christian Science Monitor, will speak at a special convocation for journalism majors and minors at 1:30 p.m. Monday in the Historical Society Museum.

Stanford is one of the members of the newsmen's panel who will question Sen. Paul Douglas at the All-University convocation Monday morning.

A color film, "Assignment-Mankind", concerning a day at the Christian Science Monitor will follow Stanford's speech. Questions from the audience will also be answered.

Stanford covers the Washington diplomatic and economic scenes for the Monitor. He has been associated with the Monitor since 1937, and served as assistant editor of the American news department of the paper for four years.

The 30-minute film is being flown in especially for the convocation from the Monitor offices.


