

NW Mizzou Easy Prey; Nebraska Waltzes 85-44

Nebraska's Huskers, led by the scoring antics of Herschel Turner and Albert Maxey hardly worked up a sweat as they raced past Missouri 85-44.

The contest was never in doubt after Nebraska ran up a 24-3 lead with 8:37 gone in the first half. The Bearcats had held the lead briefly in the opening minutes by a 2-1 count. However, the Huskers paced by Turner and Wayne Hester, hit six shots from the field that sent the Missourians reeling.

capitalized on the Bearcats inability to rebound as they rolled to a 48-17 halftime lead. The Scarlet hit a red hot .583 percentage from the field.

During the second half the Missourians fared a little better mainly because the Huskers eased some of the pressure. Coach Jerry Bush practically swept the bench while holding the score down. Even though Maxey and Turner caught the fancy of the crowd, several other Huskers were impressive. Bill Lundholm, junior guard from Mt. Pleasant, Ill., hit 6 for 6 from the field for a perfect night. Wayne Hester Lincoln Northeast grad, popped in 11 points while also shooting a good percentage.

Jim Kowalko, starting his first game for Nebraska, scored only two points, but turned in a stout defensive game and showed some good ball handling.

Bob Harry and George Swank, Nebraska's two centers, both played rebounded well. Harry pulled 11 off the boards, while Swank garnered 9 rebounds. Big George also slammed in ten points mostly in the later stages of the game.

Leading the Northwest Missouri cagers were Marland Ray with 16 points and Gene Jordan with 15. Ray was a senior letterman, while Jordan transferred from OIe Miss.

Nebraska's next game will be at home against Montana State University next Saturday.

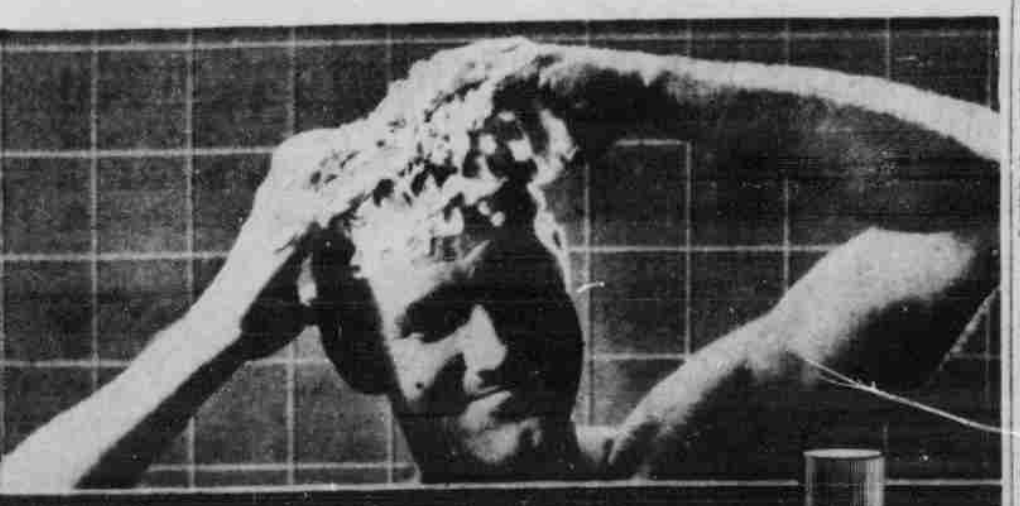
