Husker Swimmers Host Fort Hays State Today

Coach Hollie Lepley's Husker swimming team will open the 1958-59 season with Ft. Hays Kansas State College today in the Coliseum pool. The first event, the 400-yard medley relay, will begin at 4 p.m. and spectators may enter the pool through the Coliseum.

The sophomore laden squad will be shooting for their third straight victory against the Ft. Hays team.

Lepley, starting his eleventh season as Husker swim coach, will be counting on Co-Captains Bill North, Lincoln and Ron Renfer, Wyandotte, Mich., for important points in the meet. Both North and Renfer are two-year lettermen.
