### Radio Signals Detect Bloating in Animals

Bloating in animals may now be detected through the medium of radio signals.

Animal research physiologists at the University have proved it is possible to detect bloating in animals by means of a small FM transmitter placed in the animal's stomach to measure pressure changes. The device sends information back to laboratory recording machines.

about an inch in diameter and six inches long. It contains a transistor, with power supplied by an ordinary flashlight battery, enclosed

in a polyethylene case. When any pressure changes occur in the stomach of the animal, the change pushes one end of the transmitter and sends an impulse to the recorder in the laboratory.

Since transistors need no wires, a good picture of an animal's normal stomach pressures can be determined, according to Dr. Loyal Payne, associate professor of animal pathology and associate physiologist.

Cattle in which the small transmitters are placed are put on pasture, using the pasture fence as a receiving antenna. So far, no disturbances in the experimental cattle have been noted.

Animals selected are usually about ready for slaughter since this is the only way the device can be recovered. It is usually left in the animal about three weeks.




