Nebraska's swimming team won their sixth dual meet of the season as they easily downed Creighton, 64-21, in the Bluejays' home pool.

Jerry Keown walked off with individual honors as he won the 50-yard freestyle and the 200-yard butterfly. The former Omaha prepster, who just became eligible this semester, won the 50-yard freestyle in 26.3 and the butterfly in 2:42.2.

OSU Stops NU 54-39; Okla. Is Next on Road

The Huskers were dealt their eighteenth straight road loss by Oklahoma State, 54-39, Saturday night.

Cowpokes Hot
Hank Iba and his hot shooting Cowpokes combined a rugged defense with deadly shooting to down the Huskers and thus avenge two earlier season losses. The Staters raked the nets at a 48.8 percentage, while the Huskers hit only 29.6 percent.

Coach Doyle Parrack of Oklahoma plans to try and harness the Huskers by putting his 6-2, defensive ace, Buddy Hudson on high scoring Herschell Turner of Nebraska.

Joe Thompson, 6-6, former Oklahoma all-stater and high school teammate of Hudson, will be trying to put the defensive clamps on Al Maxey, the other half of the Nebraska scoring duo.

NU Matmen Lose Twice

The Air Force Academy and Colorado University pinned losses on the touring Nebraska wrestling team over the weekend.

Colorado stopped the Huskers 20-8 on Friday night, while the Falcons beat Nebraska, 25-5, Saturday.

The powerful Falcon squad won every match except for the heavyweight class which they had to forfeit. The Cadets won five decisions and won two by pins.

Although the Huskers lost five decisions, four of them were extremely close. Gail Baum lost 9-7 in the 147-lb class, while Lee Bigelow was downed in the 157-lb class by a 2-1 score.

Norlin Cooper came out on the short end of a 6-5 score in the 167-lb class, and 177-lb Ken Lott lost another close one, 1-0.

In other matches Dennis Aten was beaten 6-1 in a 137-lb match, while Ted Rethmeier and Gerald Freeland were both pinned.

AFA Hands Nebraska Gymnasts First Loss

The Nebraska gymnastics team was administered its first loss of the year by the Air Force Academy. The Cadets beat the Huskers 7 1/2 to 4 1/2 in a triangular-double dual which also included Colorado University. Nebraska beat the Buffs by a 66-46 dual score.

In the triangular competition the Air Force again came out on top with 86 points as compared to 42 1/2 for Nebraska and 25 1/2 for Colorado.

Karl Byers and Larry Brown captured the only first places in the triangular competition for the Huskers. Byers captured a first on the

sidehorse, while Brown garnered his first in the free exercise.

Nebraska also won their dual meet with Colorado State University on Friday. The Nebraskans swamped the Rams 78-34 as they captured 6 of 7 events. Charles Ellis, the Nebraska captain, led the Huskers with three first places. Phil Hall of Nebraska won two firsts, while Byers won the other.
