

## Nebraska Wrestlers Win First

The University of Nebraska wrestling squad racked up its first victory of the season Thursday night, winning the last five matches to topple Fort Hays, Kansas State, 21-15 at the Nebraska Coliseum.

Fort Hays won the first three matches to pile up a 15-0 lead over the Huskers, but Harold Thompson, Gail Baum, Norlin Cooper, Ken Lott, and Pat Fitzgerald brought the Cornhuskers from behind to win the match.

Harold Thompson started the comeback when he pinned Terry Jackson of Fort Hays in 4:28. Gail Baum copped a 6-4 decision. Heavyweight Fitzgerald also won by decision.

Norlin Cooper won his match by default when his man was unable to continue the bout, while Ken Lott pinned Merle Miller in 3:46.

Dale Votopka of Fort Hays scored an unusual pin over Ted Rethmeier of Nebraska in the first match. He pinned Rethmeier with just one second remaining in the match.

## Husker Track String Snapped At Nine by Buffs and Sooners

Oklahoma and Colorado ended Nebraska's indoor track winning string as three stadium records were broken Saturday. Colorado nipped Nebraska for 2nd, 44 1-3-44, on the last event of the meet.

Nebraska led Colorado, 44-41 1-3, but the Buffs picked up second place in the mile relay while Nebraska was shut out. This gave Colorado enough to edge the Huskers. It was the first loss in 10 starts for the Husker thinclads in indoor dual and triangular competition.

New Records  
Memorial Stadium records were broken in the mile, broad jump, and shot put. Gail Hodgson of Oklahoma broke his own record in winning the mile with a 4:13.3 clocking. Hodgson set the record last year 4:15.3. Joe Mullins of Nebraska finished second, only .1 of a second over the old record.

Mike Lindsay of Oklahoma, originally from London, shattered the shot put record with ease. Mighty Mike powered the steel ball 57 feet 10 1/2 inches, far over the old record of 53 - 10 1/2 set by Phil Delavan of Iowa State last year. Dan Erwin, Lindsay's roommate, bettered the old record, also, with a toss of 55 feet 1 1/2 inch, good enough for second place.

Bill Toomey, a sophomore from Colorado, smashed a long-standing broad jump record with a leap of 24 feet 4 1/2 inches. The old record was set in 1933 by Don Gray of Nebraska. Two and one-half inches separated 2nd and 4th places in the broad jump. Bob Knaub of Nebraska was second with 23' 2 1/2", Bob Lammell of Nebraska captured third with 23' 1 1/2" and was fourth with a 23 foot leap.

Lone NU Records  
Mullins was Nebraska's only winner with his victory in the 1000-yr run. Mullins time was 2:17.8, a stadium record, since this was the first time the event had been run. Knolly Barnes of Nebraska nipped Colorado's Bob Helming at the wire in the 880-yr. run won by Hodgson in 1:58.4.

Jim Kraft finished ahead of

Ken Pollard for the first time this season in the pole vault. Kraft was second with a vault of 13-4 and Pollard had to settle for third at 13 feet, poor for him.

Oklahoma produced the only double-winners in Dee Givens, Hodgson, and Larry Neeley. Neeley won the high jump and pole vault. Hodgson captured first in the mile and 880, while Givens won the 60-dash and low hurdles.

House Surprises  
Nebraska's strongest event turned out to be the 60-yr. dash where Don House, Don Philipps, and Tom Hodgson finished 2nd, 3rd, and 4th respectively to Big Eight champion Dee Givens.

A possible one-two finish by Colorado in the high hurdles was averted when Boyd Dwyer hit one of the barriers and didn't finish.

## NU Swim Team Splits

Coach Hollis Lepley's swimmers split in two meets the past weekend. Nebraska dropped a 51 to 33 decision to Iowa State Friday night, but came back Saturday to hand Kansas State a 49-37 beating.

In Friday night's action, Larry McClean of Nebraska shaved nearly 12 seconds off the Pool 200-yard butterfly record with a winning time of 2:28.8. A photo-finish occurred in the 50-yard free-style with Tom Thayer of Iowa State edging Nebraska's Joe Gascusana.

Nebraska won 6 of 10 events to post the victory over Kansas State. Dale Voss won the 220 and 440-yard free-style races to lead the victory.
