

Bad Weather Quells Tennis Team's Trip

"Our main trouble was the wind and cold weather," was the comment given by Nebraska tennis coach Ed Higgenbottom concerning the southern tour his team took last week.

The Huskers were victorious in their opening match of the season against the University of Tulsa, but were unsuccessful in the next four matches that followed, Albert Arrigunaga, No. 3 Corhusker, was the only winner forced to 3 sets as he outlasted the Hurricane Neal Nixon making the final team score against Tulsa, 7-0.

Oklahoma State University turned the tables the following day as they won over Nebraska, 7-0. Cold weather forced Nebraska and Oklahoma Baptist University to play the first half of that match on an inside court. The Huskers won the first three games which were held inside before

losing the last four decisive games on an outside court. Higgenbottom said, "the Nebraska team just hasn't had enough outside practice in comparison with indoor practice due to weather conditions we have had here lately."

Golfers Post 2-3 Mark On Southern Road Trip

Nebraska's golfers won two and dropped three matches in their southern swing during vacation. The Huskers fell before Oklahoma, Oklahoma State, and Tulsa but rallied to top Oklahoma Baptist University and Wichita.

Coach Bill Smith said he thought his squad did "a real good job," and sighted Larry Romjue and Mike McCuiston as being the steadiest performers throughout the trip.

Smith commented that the Huskers turned in a fine performance in their loss to Tulsa. Nebraska dropped a close decision to this team which had earlier dumped Oklahoma State, the defending Big Eight Champions.

Husker Baseballers Split With Texas Lutheran and Houston; Lose to Rice

Sometimes you win, sometimes you lose and sometimes you get rained out. That about sums up the Husker baseballers' southern trip as they won two, lost three and had one game washed out.

The Huskers split in games with Texas Lutheran and Houston winning 10-3 and 12-6 and losing 7-0 and 5-2. They dropped a 6-1 decision to Rice and the second game with Rice was canceled because of rain.

Coach Tony Sharpe stated, "I was well pleased with the pitching. They did a real fine job although we didn't give them too much help in the field. We had a lot of both mental and physical errors."

Nebraska was shut out, 7-0 by Texas Lutheran in the opening game of the trip. Bob Gleason and Lefty Hevner limited the Texans to only five hits but a pair of fielding errors, five walks and four stolen bases gave Texas Lutheran their runs. The

Huskers collected only four hits off Charles McMahon, senior righthander.

After being held scoreless for 12 consecutive innings by Texas Lutheran, Nebraska erupted for six runs in the fourth inning as the young Huskers won their first game of the campaign, 10-3. Nebraska sent 11 men to the plate in the big inning. Harry Tolly started for Nebraska and gave up only one hit before giving way to Dick Welch in the fourth inning.

Win Second
Nebraska unloaded the big lumber in the second game against Houston to take a 12-6 victory and even up the series. The Huskers had lost their first game against Houston, 5-2. Ely Churchich and lead the 12 hit attack against three Houston pitchers in the 2-6 slugfest. Churchich's blow cleared the 350-foot centerfield fence. The 5-2 defeat was called at the end of seven innings because of a time deadline.

Bob Gleason suffered his second loss of the trip as Rice scored a 6-1 victory over

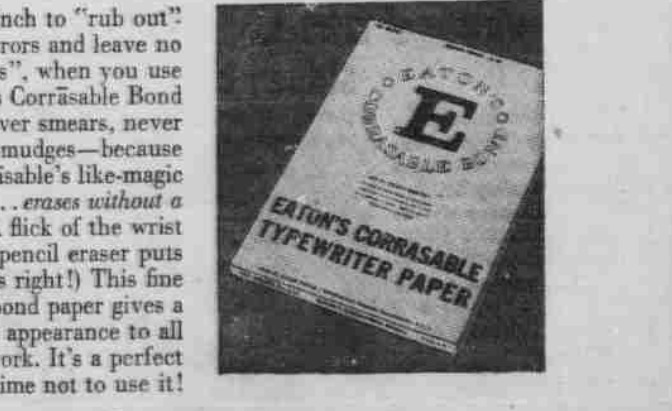

Scholarships To Rockies Available

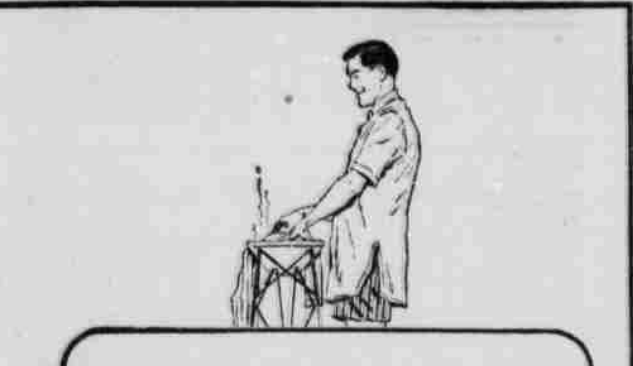
Scholarship applications for the 26th annual Writers' Conference in the Rocky Mountains are being accepted through April 30, according to Miss Margaret Robb, director.
