Hersch's Honors Cement Claims as NU's Greatest

It has been more than a month since the basketball season ended but Hersch Turner is still receiving honors to strengthen his claim as Nebraska's most honored basketball player. The latest honor to come his way was his selection to Kansas State's all-opponent first team.

He joined such select company as Oscar Robertson of Cincinnati and Arlen Clark of Oklahoma State on the team picked by the Wildcats.

Helmets All American Probably the greatest honor, Turner received this year was a third team spot on the Helms Athletic Foundation All-American team. Turner was one of only three Big Eight players chosen by the Helms Foundation. Bob Boozer of Kansas State was a first team choice and Clark of Oklahoma State joined Turner on the third team.

Award, Turner said, "It was a great honor, but I hope to do better next year."

Hersch was also named to the United Press International Big Eight first team, to Look magazine's district five all-star team. He will also receive the Walter Dobbins memorial award as the most valuable basketball player at Nebraska.

Only Junior Turner was the only Junior chosen by UPI. Rounding out the UPI first five in addition to Turner were Don Matuszak, Kansas State; Clark, Oklahoma State; Gerry Schroeder, Colorado, and Boozer, Kansas State.

Turner and Boozer were the only Big Eight representatives on the Look team. Boozer was on the All-American first team.

The Walter Dobbins memorial award is presented in honor of Walter E. Dobbins, former sports editor of the Lincoln Journal. Turner was chosen for the award by the opposing Big Eight coaches. The award will be presented May 9 as a part of All-Sports Day.

AP Falls An incident which caused considerable comment throughout the Big Eight was the Associated Press' failure to include Turner on their Big Eight first team. The AP relegated Hersch to their second team. Turner's comment on

being shunned by the AP was, "I wasn't disappointed. They picked who they thought should be on the team."

Opposing coaches had nothing but praise for the 6-2, 185 pound junior from Indianapolis, Indiana. Kansas State coach Tex Winter compared him to Oscar Robertson, Cincinnati's all-American. Winter said, "He's a tremendous basketball player and as good as anyone in the league this year."

Tex added, "I think he can do just about everything that Oscar Robertson can and just about as well. Oscar has a little edge in shooting ability, but other than that there's not much difference. Turner is a great player."

Other Coaches Colorado coach Sox Waiseth said, "Turner can really move. He has a good shot and under that Eastern-type offense, he can do his best as a fre-lancer."

Doyle Parrack of Oklahoma speaking of Turner and Al Maxe said, "Turner and Maxe are as good as anyone around. We can't do anything with them."

Jerry Bush, Turner's own coach, says, "I very definitely think he's an All-American." Bush continues, "The greatest thing about Turner is his devotion to the team. He's a real team player. He does things for us knowing that he could possibly be making a lot more points. But he's just a great kid. There's no doubt that he is one of the greatest players I have ever coached."

Scoring Record Hersch set a Nebraska single season scoring record with 428 points to lead the Huskers scoring. He also set a Nebraska record for most field goals in a single game with 14 against Detroit. Turner led the Huskers in rebounding with 244. His closest competitor in this department was Maxe with 179.

Another record which Turner will undoubtedly erase next year is the three-season scoring record of 854 held by Rex Ekwall. Hersch has a two-year total of 674 and needs only 181 points his senior year to set the record.

Turner thinks the Huskers will be better next year. He says, "I think we will be vastly improved. We will have more height and more bench strength, something which has been lacking the past two years."

Colorado Shot The feat that Nebraska basketball fans will probably remember Turner the longest for is the 40-foot shot he hit in the last five seconds to beat Colorado, 62-61 at the Coliseum in February.

Turner doesn't claim this as his biggest thrill of the '58-'59 season however. According to Turner, the biggest thrill of the season was the team's showing in the Big Eight Tourney. After his college career is over, Turner hopes to play pro basketball and then go into commercial art as an illustrator.

R.O.T.C. Rifle Team to Hold Invitational Gallery Competition

The Varsity Rifle Team in conjunction with the ROTC department will sponsor the Sixth Annual Invitational Gallery Championship Match.

The match to be held April 18-19 will be the largest intercollegiate event of the year. Eleven colleges and universities with 130 riflemen will participate in the event which will be held in the basement of the Military and Naval Science Building.

Awards amounting to \$450 will be given by the Varsity Rifle Club and commercial firms.

The meet will consist of three matches.

The first will be a team match with a possible 300 points to be fired from the prone, kneel and stand positions.

The second will be an individual match with a possible 200 points to be fired from the prone and stand positions.

The third match will consist of the scores of the first two matches added together for the total points of each college.

The Lincoln Air Force Base will provide lodging for the riflemen.

The match which started in

1954 with 5 schools and 55 shooters has grown to be the largest intercollegiate event of its kind in the Midwest.

The University will have two teams of 10 men each in the event.

The Cyclones won one and lost two to Oklahoma, but the losses were by one-run margins.

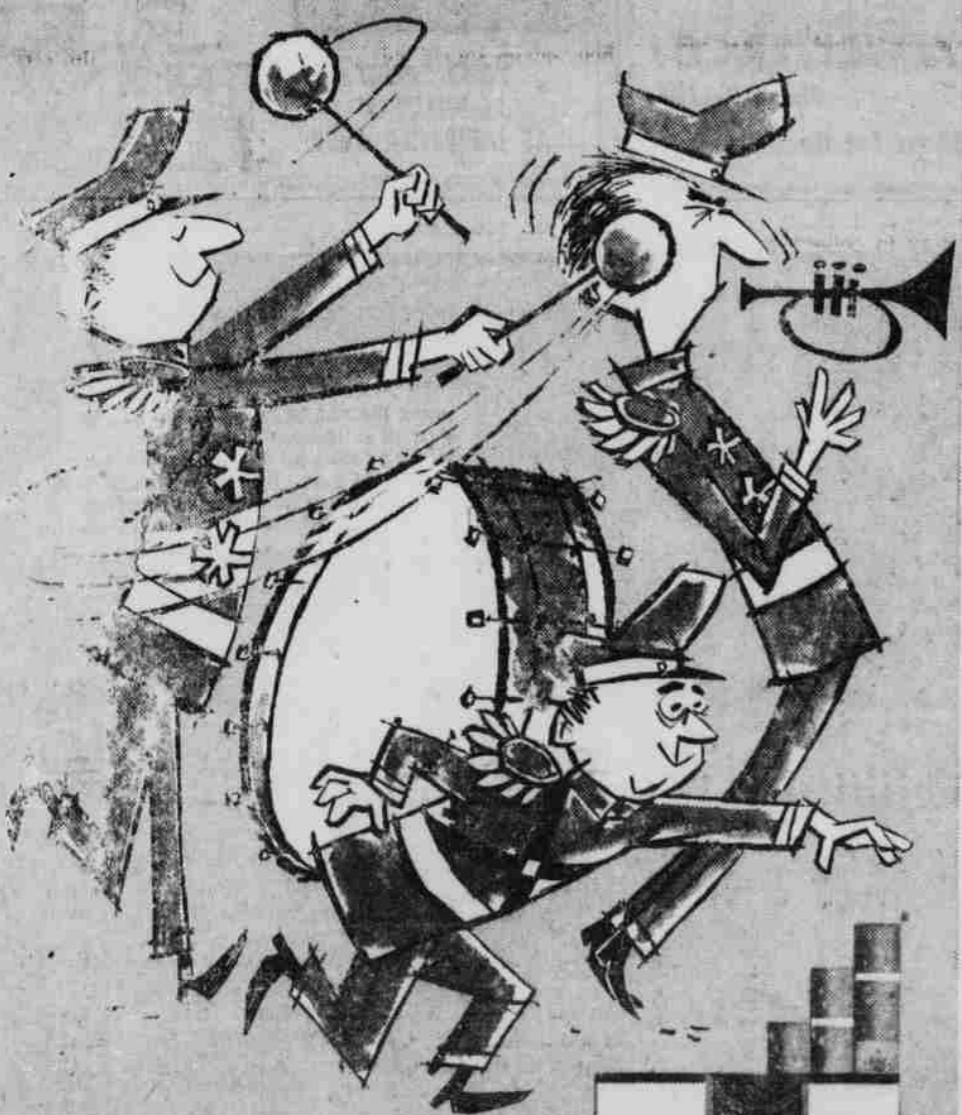

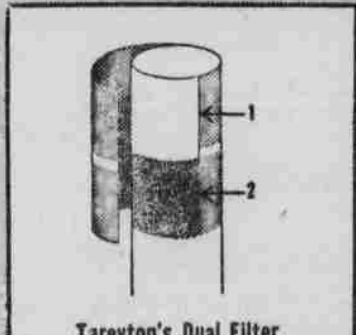
