

Hardin Tells Regents Staff Turnover Average

Turnover on the University of Nebraska faculty has averaged about 23% in two years, Chancellor Clifford Hardin told the Board of Regents Saturday.

Hardin pointed out that more than 145 persons had resigned in the last two years and that "money was the most common reason for the resignation.

Also at the Regents meeting Dr. Robert M. Koch was elevated to professor and chairman of the University department of animal husbandry effective Sept. 1. He will succeed Prof. William J. Loeffel as chairman.
