Research Grant Given

A grant of \$11,730 has been received by two fulltime faculty members at the University of Nebraska College of Medicine in Omaha.

Sponsored by the National Heart Institute of the National Institutes of Health, the funds will aid in the study of cardiac action of rhodochlorin on warm-blooded animals.

The chemical has previously been used in experimental research at the college on frog hearts, and it is hoped that this chlorophyll derivative will eventually be applicable to the human heart.

Researchers to whom the grant has been awarded are Dr. A. R. McIntyre, Chairman of the Department of Physiology and Pharmacology, and Dr. Merrill J. Hendrickson, Research Associate.

KUON-TV Offers English Class To Perfect Communication Skills

Again this summer, KUON-TV will offer its "Short Course to Better English." The review series will be offered starting July 13, at 7 p.m. and will run for three weeks.

Patterned after last summer's series, the telecourse is again taught by Mrs. Helen Graham of the University Extension Division.

The review course is designed to offer opportunities for viewers in the general audience to perfect their use of the English language and to increase their communication skills. The refresher drill is also of specific value to prospective University students.

Approximately 138 persons registered for last year's course which gave attention to the principles of spelling as well as to the fundamentals of grammar and the mechanics of correct punctuation.

The review sessions were especially directed to incoming freshmen whose English placement tests showed them

to be below college level in their spelling, word usage and writing practices.

A syllabus or course outline is available for \$1. It may be secured after July 1 by writing to KUON-TV.

A final examination for the course will be given on the University campus Friday, July 31, for those students who wish to become qualified for registration in English B, a college credit course in September.
