Big Eight Gridders Improve Records; Win Four, Lose Four

 Big Eight conference football teams managed to break even the past weekend winning four and losing four. This was a vast improvement over a week ago when Iowa State was the only team posting a victory.

The scores for the past weekend were Nebraska 32, Minnesota 12; Iowa State 28, Denver 12; Missouri 20, Michigan 15; Kansas State 28, South Dakota State 12; Northwestern 45, Oklahoma 13; Baylor 15, Colorado 7; Syracuse 35, Kansas 21; Arkansas 13, Oklahoma State 7.

After a close first half, Nebraska waltzed to an easy win over Minnesota. The Huskers displayed a stubborn defense along with good passing and running.

Iowa State made it two in

a row with a Friday night win over Denver. The Cyclones are the only conference team with two victories.

Nichols
 Dwight Nichols, an all-American candidate, ran for two touchdowns and passed for the other two Iowa State touchdowns.

It took a Missouri touchdown in the last two seconds to give the Tigers a 20-15 win over Michigan. Bob Haas, second-string quarterback, set up the touchdown with a 36-yard pass to Danny LaRose and then dove into the end zone from the two-yard line for the score.

Kansas State scored 22 points in the second half while holding South Dakota State scoreless to overcome a 12-6 halftime deficit.

Jack Marcoline scored two of the Wildcat TD's, one of them on a 57 yard run.

Northwestern handed Oklahoma its worst beating since Bud Wilkinson became head coach. Northwestern scored in every quarter in overwhelming the Sooners, who fumbled 11 times and lost the ball on five of those occasions.

74-Yard Run
 Colorado scored first in their encounter with Baylor but the Bears fought back to take a 15-7 win. Ronnie Bull,

sophomore halfback, was in on both Baylor touchdowns. He scored the first on a 74-yard run and was on the receiving end of a 10-yard pass for the other.

John Hadl was the Kansas star for the second week in a row but the Jayhawks also went down to defeat for the second successive week.

Hadl returned a kickoff 97 yards for a score and scored again on a 12-yard run but Syracuse was the victor, 35-21. Hadl also boomed quick kicks of 63 and 59 yards.

Arkansas scored 13 points in the first half while holding Oklahoma State scoreless, then held on for a 13-7 victory. Oklahoma State contributed 12 fumbles to the Razorback cause.

Six teams swing into conference action this week with

Colorado at Oklahoma, Missouri at Iowa State and Oklahoma State at Kansas State. Nebraska and Kansas wait another week before they begin conference play. They meet each other October 10 in Lincoln.

This week Nebraska is at home against Oregon State and Kansas plays host to Boston University.

After two weeks of play the Big Eight conference has a record of five wins and ten losses. Oklahoma, Colorado, Kansas and Oklahoma State will be looking for their first wins.
