

# Bohanan and Siemer Named Co-Captains

Seniors Bill Bohanan, fullback, and Dale Siemer, guard, will share the captain duties for the Huskers against Indiana.

Bohanan was switched to fullback following the Minnesota tilt when Don Fricke was injured. He was, previously, an end and a center, lettering last year as an end. Siemer has seen ample duty this year as a guard.

The Huskers were put through a defensive scrimmage Tuesday.

"The breaks make the real difference," said Coach Jennings when asked if the fact that Minnesota beat Indiana 24-14, two weeks ago, gave the Cornhuskers an edge next

Saturday. Jennings also said that he planned to go with Martin, Bohanan and Kitchen at the fullback position in that order barring further injuries.

At quarterback, will be Tolly, Meade and Rutigliano with the absence of Kramer. Gene Ward, newly converted quarterback, may also see action.

Indiana will wrap up Nebraska's non-conference foes for this season. A win would give the Huskers a 2-1 advantage.

Missouri will re-open Nebraska's Big Eight schedule next week followed by Oklahoma, Iowa State, Colorado and Kansas State.

Speaking of Iowa State, Schminkel said, "We don't know too much about Iowa State, but I understand they have some speedy backs." The Cyclones operate from the single wing.

The Huskers alternate unit will have Larry Tomlinson at left end; Bennie Abson, left tackle; Bob Jones, left guard; Ron Rissler, center; Ty Robertson, right guard; Ron Michka, right tackle; Larry Donovan, right end.

Ernie Bonistall will be calling signals for the alternates with Gary Larsen running at left halfback and Isaac Newton at right half. Jim Burd will be the fullback.

The Nebraska starters average 194 pounds with the line tipping the scales at 198 average and the backs averaging 188. The line from tackle to tackle averages 202 pounds.

John Faiman, all-stater from Omaha South, has been particularly impressive in drills this fall. In the last intrasquad scrimmage, he threw two touchdown passes and ran for a third.

## Zaruba Receives Star Award for KU Game

"Every year a thrill-and that includes 12 consecutive years," are words of one of the most colorful players on the Nebraska football team, better known as Carroll "Pappy" Zaruba, this week's star of the week.

This honor seems to be a yearly occurrence with the 25-year old Zaruba who has played football since the age of 13.

132 Pound Freshman "Pappy" started his football career at Fullerton High

School as a 132 pound freshman. After completing high school, where he was named all-conference and all-state, Carroll enrolled at Doane College and added to his list of accomplishments.

He set a new NCC scoring record and further distinguished himself by setting a new freshman 100-yard dash record in the spring.

Zaruba then played two years of service ball with the Camp Lejeune Marines in North Carolina where he picked up even more experience and finesse before enrolling at Nebraska.

Always a consistent performer, Zaruba leads the Huskers this season in yardage with 127 yards in 31 carries and has a respectable 4.1 yards per carry average after four games.

When asked whom he would name as the most outstanding player he has ever played against, Carroll declined to single out one individual, but gave a list of players that includes such greats as, Thomas O'Connell of Illinois, Bill Reynolds of Pittsburg and the Chicago Bears, and Johnny Lattner of Notre Dame.

Looking forward to next Saturday and the remainder of the schedule, Zaruba had this to say, "They're all good teams, including Indiana. The fans shouldn't count us out because of last Saturday's game."

"Nebraska has a lot of potential left. It's still possible to come out on top of the Big Eight. We aren't the kind of team to let down after one defeat."
