Huskers Offense Continues To Sputter; Oklahoma Next

Nebraska's feeble offense continued to struggle hopelessly against Missouri as the Huskers were shut out by the Tigers, 0-0, Saturday.

It was the second shutout of the season suffered by the Huskers with the other whitewashing coming at the hands of Texas, 20-0 in the season opener. Only once has Nebraska scored more than one touchdown.

Oklahoma received one of their greatest scares in years before pulling out a 7-6 victory over Kansas, Saturday. It was the 74th consecutive conference game without a defeat for the Sooners.

Oklahoma scored first with quarterback Bobby Boyd going over from the one. Jim Davis added the extra point kick to make it 7-0 at half-time.

The Sooners narrowly squeaked by Kansas, 7-6, for their 74th conference game

without a loss. The victory put Oklahoma atop the Big Eight standings with a 3-0 mark, a familiar position for them.

The game will be a part of Nebraska's homecoming ceremonies which may provide some added incentive for the Huskers. Nebraska hasn't beaten Oklahoma since 1942 when they took a 7-0 victory over the Sooners at Norman.

This was also the last game Oklahoma has lost to a conference team at Norman. Oklahoma has scored at least four touchdowns against the Huskers in every game since 1948.

The Sooners hold a slight margin over Nebraska in the series history with the Huskers winning 16, losing 19 and three ties. Oklahoma is the only conference team which Nebraska trails in games won

and lost over the years. Missouri received the kickoff from Nebraska to start both halves and moved to a score before relinquishing the ball in both instances.

After the Tigers took the opening kickoff, they moved to the Nebraska 43-yard line where the Huskers, forced them to punt but the officials

called a roughing penalty against Noel Martin, Husker fullback.

The penalty gave Missouri a first down on Nebraska's 28 but the Husker defense stiffened after the Tigers advanced to the Husker 9-yard line. Nebraska pushed them back to the 15 from where Ed Mehrer kicked a field goal giving the Tigers a 3-0 lead.

The other Missouri tally came after an 86-yard kickoff return to start the second half. It took Missouri quarterback Bob Haas just two plays to put the ball in the end zone and wrap up the scoring for the afternoon.

Joe American Horse of Nebraska trailed Mullins for third. Other Nebraskans earning points were Dick Kier

who finished sixth, Bill Melody, was seventh, Paul Nielson came in ninth and Ken Ash was in the tenth spot.
