first Homecoming game on record was a 1919 win over Kansas. Nebraska's coach was Henry Schulte, who piloted his team to the Missouri Valley Championship. The game was played at the State Fair Grounds.

In the 1924 game, the Huskers were given even odds against the Jayhawks from Kansas. It was the first Homecoming game to be played in the newly constructed Memor-ial Stadium.

Nebraska scored twice in the final quarter to win 13-6. The University went on to win the Big Six Championship and produce its sixth All American—Ed Weir.

Besides Homecoming, the appearance of spooks, witches, black cats and jack-o-lanterns marks the arrival of Halloween.


