Chuck Stacey, Phi Kappa Psi tailback, led the balloting for the Daily Nebraskan's all-university intramural football team which has four repeaters from last year's team.

Stacey received every vote but one for the all-university tailback spot with that vote going to Dick Hergenrader of Sigma Nu.

Others named to the Daily Nebraskan team are end Ron Svoboda of Phi Kappa Psi, wingback Bob Eyth of Phi Kappa Psi and center Jack Muck of Phi Delta Theta.

Stacey and Eyth were instrumental in the Phi Kappa Psi win over Phi Delta Phi for the all-university championship as they teamed on passes to score all 13 points for the Phi Psi's.

Player sketches:
END DON WENZL—Wenzl is a 6-2, 175-pounder and is a senior in Business Administration. He competes in intramural basketball and volleyball as well as football. Wenzl was named to the Daily Nebraskan all-university basketball team the last two years and as all-university in football last year.

He attended Lincoln Northeast high school where he earned three letters in baseball, two in basketball and one in football. He was an all-state honorable mention in football.

END RON SVOBODA—Svoboda stands 5-9 and weighs 150 pounds. He is a senior in Business Administration. He averaged two touchdowns per game this fall. He also competes in basketball, volleyball, softball and track on the intramural level.

Svoboda was a member of last year's Phi Kappa Psi all-university championship volleyball team. He lettered three times in basketball and once in football at Beatrice high school.

CENTER JACK MUCK—Muck carries 185 pounds on a 5-7 frame and is a senior in Business Administration. He takes part in several other intramural sports including track, water basketball, basketball, handball, tennis, badminton and volleyball.

Muck was a member of the doubles tennis championship team in 1956. While attending Lincoln High, he lettered twice each in track and football. He was all-city and all-state honorable mention in football and a member of the Lincoln High mile relay team which finished third in the state meet in '56.

BLOCKING BACK CHUCK GREENWALD—Greenwald is a 6-0, 200-pound junior majoring in math. He was a member of the Daily Nebraskan all-university football team

last year and he also participates in softball, track and Greenwald is coach of the NROTC basketball team.

He attended Reitz Memorial high school in Evansville, Ind., where he lettered twice in football, twice in track and four times in baseball. Greenwald was all-city in football.

BLOCKING BACK CHARLES ARIZUMI—Arizumi is 5-8 and weighs 168 pounds. He is a senior in pre-dentistry. Arizumi competes in many intramural sports including handball, water basketball, volleyball, wrestling, horseshoes and pa dieball.

He was a member of the Daily Nebraskan all-university intramural football team last year. Arizumi lettered in swimming and football three times each at Punahou Academy in Honolulu.

WINGBACK BOB EYTH—Eyth is 5-11 and weighs 162 pounds. He is a senior with a major in speech and minoring in physical education. He plans to coach after graduation. Eyth also competes in basketball, track, handball and volleyball.

He won the 60-yard dash, one-lap race and 440-yard dash in last year's intramural track meet. Eyth lettered four years in track at Beatrice high school and was second in the state meet in the 100-yard dash and 220-yard dash as Beatrice won the state track championship in 1956.

TAILBACK CHUCK STACEY—Stacey is captain of this year's all-university team and stands 6-3 and tips the scales at 190 pounds. He is a senior in pre-law. Stacey also competes in basketball, volleyball, ping pong and horseshoes on the intramural level.

He received honorable mention on the Daily Nebraskan's all-university basketball team the past two years and was all-university in football last year. Chuck earned 13 letters at Weeping Water high school, lettering four times in basketball and football, three in track and two in baseball. He is a member of the Mutual Benefit AAU basketball team.

Best NU Grid Season Since 1954 Is Possible

Nebraska needs only a victory over Kansas State in the final game of the season to finish the season with a .500 record.

The last time Nebraska enjoyed five wins was in 1954 when they took a 5-5 record to the Orange Bowl. The Wildcats defeated Nebraska last year, 23-6. Two years ago, the Huskers only win came against Kansas State, 14-7.

Kansas State has won only one game this year while losing eight. Their lone win came against South Dakota State in the second game of the season and since then, the Wildcats have lost seven in a row.

Nebraska worked out in sweat clothes Monday and remained inside. Everyone is expected to be ready to play in the season finale.

Pat Clare continued to lead the Huskers in total offense with 21 yards in three carries for a seven-yard average. Carroll "Pappy" Zaruba moved into second place, ahead of Clay White, by virtue of his performance against Colorado.

The senior halfback carried the ball 18 times for a total of 129 yards against the

Bufs, raising his season totals to 337 yards gained on 69 carries. Zaruba has averaged 4.9 yards per carry. Zaruba is also the leading scorer with 24 points on four touchdowns. Clay White is second with 18 points.

K-State Sets Collegiate Rifle Record

Kansas State's rifle team broke a national collegiate rifle shooting record in a 1453-1412 win over Nebraska. The old record was 1444.

Nebraska's score of 1412 was the best of the year for the Huskers. The loss was the first in the conference for Nebraska and leaves them with a 4-2 record.

The other loss came at the hands of Creighton but the Husker shooters avenged that loss in a later match.

Conley Cleveland led the Nebraskans in the loss to Kansas State with 288 of a possible 300 points. He was followed by Dick Christensen with 284, Bill Holland 283, Marvin Cox 280 and Mike Flannigan 277.
