Eight letterwinners return to the Nebraska swimming team as Dick Klaas begins his first year as head coach.

Klaas replaces Hollie Lepley who resigned to accept a position at Michigan State.

The returning lettermen are Joe Bonnemeier, Roger Bosveld, Ron Bucklin, Joe Gacusana, Larry McClean, Joe Stocker, Frank Tomson and Branch Walton.

Tomson is a senior who has earned two varsity letters. He placed in both the 100 and 200-yard back stroke at the conference meet last year.

Bucklin is also a senior and a double letterwinner. He is a versatile performer and holds the Nebraska record in the 200-yard individual medley.

McClean and Stocker are also varsity record holders with McClean claiming the butterfly record and Stocker owning the breaststroke mark.

Stocker placed in both the 100 and 200-yard breaststroke events in last year's conference meet.

Turner considers beating Kansas and Kansas State during his sophomore year and playing against Oscar Robertson in high school as his two greatest thrills.

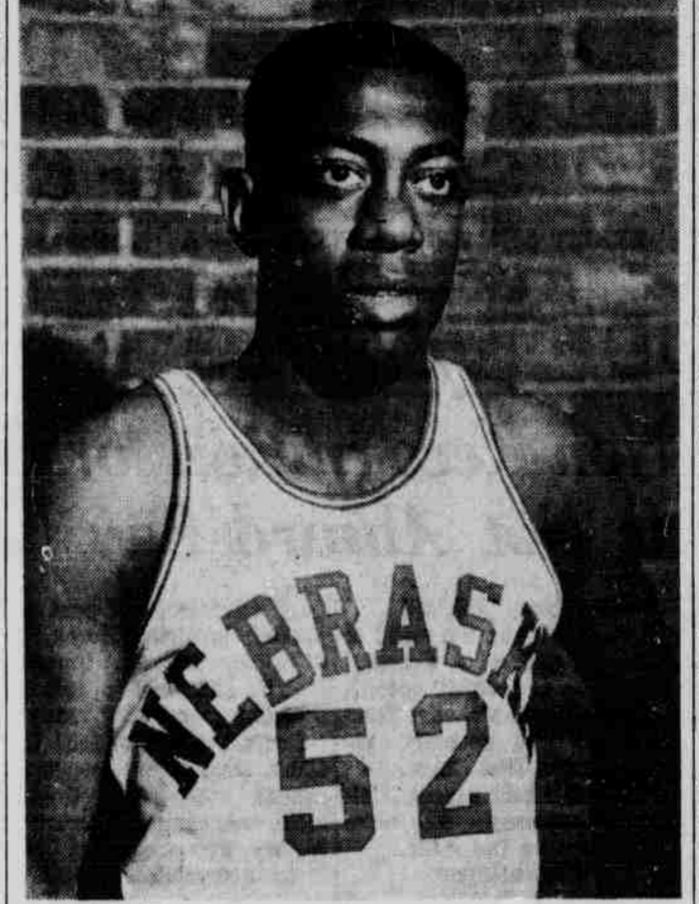
"I'll never forget beating those two Kansas teams," said Turner.
