

Cold Huskers Lose To KU

Missouri Is Next Opponent

Nebraska's slump ridden cagers, connecting on only 30 per cent of their shots from the field, dropped their second conference game in as many starts to Kansas 60-47 Saturday night.

The Huskers take to the road this week in search of their first loop win and their first win of the new year. They meet Missouri tonight and then travel to Boulder for an encounter with Colorado Saturday.

Huskers On TV

The Colorado game will be regionally televised Saturday afternoon. It will be the final game for Nebraska until after final exams when they host the Buffs Jan. 30.

Saturday's game was the first conference test for the Jayhawks and gives them a 1-0 record.

Nebraska outrebounded the taller Kansans 44-43 but couldn't keep pace with them in scoring as the Jayhawks sank 25 of 56 field goal attempts for 44.6 per cent.


The opening minutes were a good indication of things to come as the Huskers went eight minutes after Hersch Turner opened the scoring with a jump shot until Bob Harry hit the next Husker field goal.

Nebraska scored only six points during the first 13½ minutes as the Jayhawks raced to a 20-6 lead and the Huskers never caught them.

The closest Nebraska came after that was 37-32 early in the second half but with Bill Bridges and Al Donaghue leading the way the Jayhawks stretched the margin to 43-32 midway in the second period.

Turner and Harry were the only Huskers hitting close to 50 per cent from the field. Turner made good on 6 of 11 attempts and Harry found the range on four of eight. Al Maxey scored only two field goals on 16 attempts.

Turner led the Nebraska scoring with 14 points and needs only seven more to be-

come the first Husker player to score 900 points. Turner was followed by Maxey with nine, Kowalke and Harry with eight each in the Nebraska scoring column.

Maxey was the leading rebounder for the Huskers with 12.

Al Donaghue of Kansas topped all scorers for the evening with 18 followed by Wayne Hightower with 16 and Bill Bridges with 14. Bridges was the top rebounder with 17.

Missouri, tonight's oppon-

ent, lost a 65-60 decision to Kansas State Saturday. It was the Tigers second loss against no wins in conference play as they dropped an earlier game to Oklahoma State. The Tigers are 6-6 overall while the Huskers have a 4-9 overall mark.

Stocker Sets Record But KU Mermen Win

Joe Stocker of Nebraska set a new Varsity record in the 200-yard Breaststroke for the only Husker first place finish as Kansas took an easy 75-20 victory Saturday at the Coliseum Pool.

Stocker's winning time of 2:34.4 was 2.4 seconds under the old record also held by Stocker. His previous record was 2:36.8 set against Kansas State in a pre-Christmas meet.

The loss gives Nebraska a 1-1 record in dual matches with the win coming over Kansas State. The next Husker outing is Saturday when they travel to Marysville,

Mo. for an encounter with Northwest Missouri.

Diving was the only event in which Nebraska had two performers in the top three positions. Branch Walton finished second and Jim Frank finished third behind Kansas' Larry Prather. Prather scored 174.30 points for first place while Walton had 158.20 for second.

Huskers scoring points beside Stocker, Walton and Frank were Kuni Mihara, Larry McClean, Ron Bucklin, Myron Papadakis and Frank Tomson.

Mihara was third in both the 200 and 400-yard free style events and McClean was second in both the 50 and 100-yard free style races. Bucklin finished third in the 200-yard individual medley, Papadakis was third in the 200-yard butterfly and Tomson was third in the 200-yard backstroke.

Kansas won both the 400-yard medley relay and the 400-yard free style relay.

The Huskers next home meet is Feb. 5 against Northwest Missouri.

Turner Needs Seven Points To Reach 900

Herschell Turner, one of the greatest players in Nebraska basketball history and certainly the greatest scorer, needs only seven points in tonight's game against the Missouri Tigers to become the first player in Nebraska basketball to score 900 points.

The Indianapolis, Ind. native already holds most of the Nebraska scoring records. Turner's top point output of this season is 35 points against the Tigers in the Big Eight pre-season tourney.

Raschke Is Lone NU Winner In 27-5 Defeat

Jim Raschke scored the only Nebraska victory of the evening Friday by pinning Mankato heavyweight Waylon Blake in 5:10 as Mankato State triumphed 27-5.

It was the fourth loss in as many starts for the young Husker grapplers with previous losses coming at the hands of Oklahoma, Oklahoma State and Colorado

Mines. Raschke's win gives him a record of two wins, one loss and one tie. He is the only Nebraskan to win this season.

Never Trained

Raschke never trailed in his match with the heavier Blake as he opened the match with a 2-0 lead on a takedown. Blake came back to tie it up on a reversal only to have Raschke score one point with an escape.

The Nebraska heavyweight was leading 3-2 when the pin came.

The closest Nebraska could come to victory in the other matches was in the 147-pound class where Wayne Reeves dropped a 7-5 decision to Mankato's John Lindeman. Reeves and Lindeman battled to a 0-0 tie for the first three minutes.

But Lindeman took a 2-0 lead as the second period opened. Reeves made it 2-1 with an escape only to fall behind 4-1 when Lindeman scored a takedown. Reeves escaped once more to make it 4-2 as the second period ended.

Reeves Escapes

With Lindeman on top to start the final three minute period, Reeves narrowed the gap to 4-3 with another es-

cape maneuver but Lindeman fought right back with a takedown to make it 6-3. Reeves once more closed the deficit to one point with a reversal but Lindeman escaped to make the score 7-5 as the match ended.

Dave Frame of Mankato State won the 130-pound class by forfeit when Phil Johnson, Nebraska's 130-pounder failed to appear.
