## Swimmer Joe Stocker Is Star of the Week

A record setter in his own right is swimmer Joe Stocker, this week's Star of the Week.

The 6-1 junior, who specializes in the 200 yard breaststroke, toured the distance in 2:34.4, 2.4 seconds under the old record, last week against Kansas U.

Stocker had just set the 2:36.8 mark a week earlier against Kansas State.

The 20-year-old pre-med student said he felt that Nebraska's biggest weakness was in the sprint freestylers.

Stocker plays the role of an iron man as he competes in three events. In addition to his 200 yard breaststroke, Stocker displays his talents on the 400-yard medley relay team and in the 100 yard freestyle. His best time in the latter event is 1:00.

## Nebraska Falter Against Tigers; Oklahoma Pummels Iowa State

Missouri, touted as a Big Eight darkhorse after a good preholiday showing, came off a five game losing streak to bounce Nebraska's hapless Cornhuskers in Columbia Monday night, 69-61.

Nebraska took their 10th loss in the last 11 games the hard way, stumbling after managing a 34-34 halftime tie. But the Huskers hustled back to press 61-63 on a pair of late fielders by Jim Kowalke.

Two fouts by sophomore Rex Swett gave the Tigers the chance to take the pressure off at the foul line before veteran Missouri forward Charles Henke iced the win with his eighth fielder of the evening.

### Kowalke High

Henke and Joe Scott, a pair of senior deadeyes, led Missouri with 19 and 17 respectively. Kowalke salvaged game honors for Nebraska with 23 aided by Herschell Turner's 17.

Nebraska will try to hit the win column Saturday against Colorado at Boulder. The Buffs tuned up for Coach Jerry Bush's crew by bouncing Kansas 65-61. It was the first win for Colorado in three Big Eight encounters.

It was a night for upsets. Iowa State, preseason tourney winner and most sports writers' pick for the conference crown dropped its first

in loop action to Oklahoma, 65-47.

### Hit 50%

Oklahoma, expected to make a strong bid for the title themselves, hit 50% from the floor to ease the way. Iowa State's touted sophomore, Vinnie Brewer was held to eight points, his season's low.

In the other Big Eight contest Monday, Kansas State, last year's champ with a 14-0 mark got another leg up on a repeat crown. The Wildcats, who have steadied aft-

er early season rough slogging, clawed Oklahoma State, 54-49. It was the Cats third straight and left them the only unbeaten conference squad. High scorer for K-State was Ced Price, 6'6" football end who has apparently recovered from a dislocated shoulder.
