Students Rehearse for Opera

"Die Fledermaus," an opera written by Johann Strauss, will be presented by music students under the direction of Prof. Leon Lishner Feb. 4-7 at Howell Theater.

"Die Fledermaus" or "The Bat" is set in Vienna in the year 1874, with most of the action taking place in the palace of Prince Orlofsky.

The atmosphere and flavor of the period have been preserved by means of elaborate and colorful costumes, Prof. Lishner said.

He described the opera as "having the character of an operetta." It is considered a masterpiece of its kind, being a light, melodious production which has been enjoyed for years in theaters throughout the world.

The tunes are familiar to many because they have become part of the popular operetta class of music of the world, Prof. Lishner noted. Among the best known are "Laughing Song" and "Czardas".

Members of the casts include Amer Lincoln and Gene Dybdahl as Eisenstein; Diane Butherus and Gayle Johnson as Roselinda; Virginia Duxbury and Judy Lawrence as Adele; Irvin Pearson and Cal Carlson as Blind.

Wayne Robertson and Ken Scheffel will play the role of Alfred; Norman Riggins and Bill Hatcher will play Frank; Lou Lawson and Richard Morris will play the role of Falke; and Paula Knepper and Syl-

via Rigg will play Orlofsky. Prof. Lishner remarked he felt the casts were of particularly high caliber this year.

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
