NU Track Team Wins; Two Stadium Records Set

Nebraska's track team added dual victory number two to its record Saturday by dumping Oklahoma State 66-56.

Five meet records fell, one was tied and two stadium records were established during the afternoon's activity. At the end of eight events the Huskers held a 38-33 lead, but a shutout by Nebraska's Milt Haedt, Steve Smith and Bill Fasano in the high hurdles iced the meet for the Huskers.

For the second week coach Frank Sevigne did not enter a mile relay team. In Saturday's contest two Cowboy teams ran against each other. Two Oklahoma Staters stole the spotlight, as they established new stadium and meet records.

inch, but failed three times. The other stadium record fell in the 880, when OSU sophomore Bill Stone captured a 1:56.1 time for first place honors. Stone, record holder of the Big 8 conference postal mark of 1:52.2, shaded the existing record.

Aubrey Dooley, a 15 foot pole vaulter from OSU, cleared 14 feet seven and one fourth inches to topple a record set last year by Ken Pollard. Pollard vaulted 14 feet six inches last year against Oklahoma State. Dooley tried to crack the 15 foot barrier when the bar was set at 15 feet, one half

Other meet records were set by Al Wellman in the shotput and Tom Harlan of Oklahoma State in the 440 yard run.

Haedt's time of :7.7 in the high hurdles tied the meet record. Wellman continued his record breaking performances, registering a toss of 50 feet 1 and one half inches. Last week Wellman set a Drake So. Dak. triangular meet record with a toss of 51-2.

The 440 proved to be another crowd pleaser, as Tom Harlan nipped Nebraska's Bob Cross at the tape. Harlan turned in a time of :50.7 for his meet record.

The Huskers added another sprint man to their crew. High hurdler Steve Smith a South Dakota transfer student from Lexington, made his first appearance of the year, placing second, a step behind team mate Milt Haedt. OSU demonstrated its power in the 2 mile event, when Miles Eisenman breezed his way to victory. Eisenman is the conference record holder for this event. In both the long distance

runs, Eisenman was hampered by Nebraska's Joe American Horse. American Horse garnered a victory in the mile run, but Eisenman's easy running style proved too much for Joe in the two mile.

Mullins scored the only double victory of the afternoon, as he grabbed first in the 600 and 1000 yard runs. The Huskers will be looking for their third straight dual victory Tuesday evening when they face Kansas State. Field events are scheduled to start at 7:00 p.m., while the running events will start at 7:30 p.m.

Cowboy's Defense Halts NU Bunch Leads OSU Attack

The combination of a tough Oklahoma State defense and sharp shooting by OSU's Eddie Bunch, proved to be too much for Nebraska, as the Cowboys scored a 52-47 victory over the Huskers Saturday night.

The Oklahoma sophomore dumped in 21 points on his home court in Stillwater. His total was the highest for the season for an Oklahoma State player and also his career high. From midway in the first half, when Oklahoma State jumped to a 17-6 lead, the Cowboys commanded the scoreboard throughout the game. Nebraska chopped the margin in the closing seconds of the first half to a 25-22 reading, but OSU turned on the pressure in the early minutes of the final half to pull away.

The Cowboys added the icing to their victory in the late minutes when they dropped six straight free tosses through the nets. Oklahoma State's defense, one of the nations best, held Husker Captain Herschell Turner scoreless until the last 12 minutes of play.

Husker Matmen Drop Two Meets

Nebraska wrestlers dropped two meets during the weekend. The Husker grapplers were stopped by the Air Force Academy, 30-10, Friday evening and lost to South Dakota State 21-9 in Brookings Saturday.

In the Friday contest, Husker Jim Faimon, graduate of Nebraska School for the Blind, pinned Jim Fey of the Academy.

Faimon is the second Husker to win a match this season. In Saturday's outing, Nebraska was plagued by weight forfeits, having to default three matches to South Dakota for failing to meet weight requirements in the 157 pound, 167 pound, and 177 pound classes.

Faber Jenkins, Nebraska's 130 pounder, joined the winning ranks of Faimon and heavyweight Jim Raschke. All three won by decisions.
