Star Of The Week Big 8 Diving Title Eyed by Frank

Consistency might be a good by-word for this week's Star of the Week. He is diver Jim Frank.

Frank, who excels in diving and swims when he is needed, has been honored on the basis of his constant contribution throughout the season to the N.U. swimming team. The second sophomore swimmer to receive the Star of the Week award this year has scored over 50 points in 15 dual and one invitational meet during the past season in his special one and three meter diving events.

Preps For Big Meet
Frank will accompany his teammates to Boulder, Colo. this weekend where they will complete their 1959-1960 season in the Big Eight conference meet.

"Nebraska should take third or fourth, Oklahoma, without a doubt, will win the meet and I imagine K. U. will be second. Iowa State should be close to the top too," Frank predicted. As a pre-dent student Frank said the Nebraska swimming team should be at its best in two years for as many reasons. "First, the high school swimming programs are increasing each year. Three

years ago there were seven high schools with swimming sports. Now there are 12. Also, kids now have a chance to swim competitively during the summers.

Great Recruiter
"The other reason is that Klas is a great recruiter. He has built the Nebraska team quite a bit and he will continue to do so in the future," Frank pointed out. Frank did his high school swimming at Lincoln Southeast High school where he won the State diving championship for two years, the City diving championship for three years and the Mid-East Conference diving championship for three years. Placing second in the one and three meter diving events at the regional AAU meet last summer at Topeka, Kans., and being named high school all-American for two consecutive years were Frank's greatest thrills.

Had Many Offers
The six foot, 150 pound Star picked N. U. after he had turned down offers from Ohio, Michigan, Annapolis, Oklahoma, Yale and others. "I felt going to Nebraska would be more convenient as I could live at home," Frank said. Frank concluded that he has no ambitions what so ever to continue his diving after college.

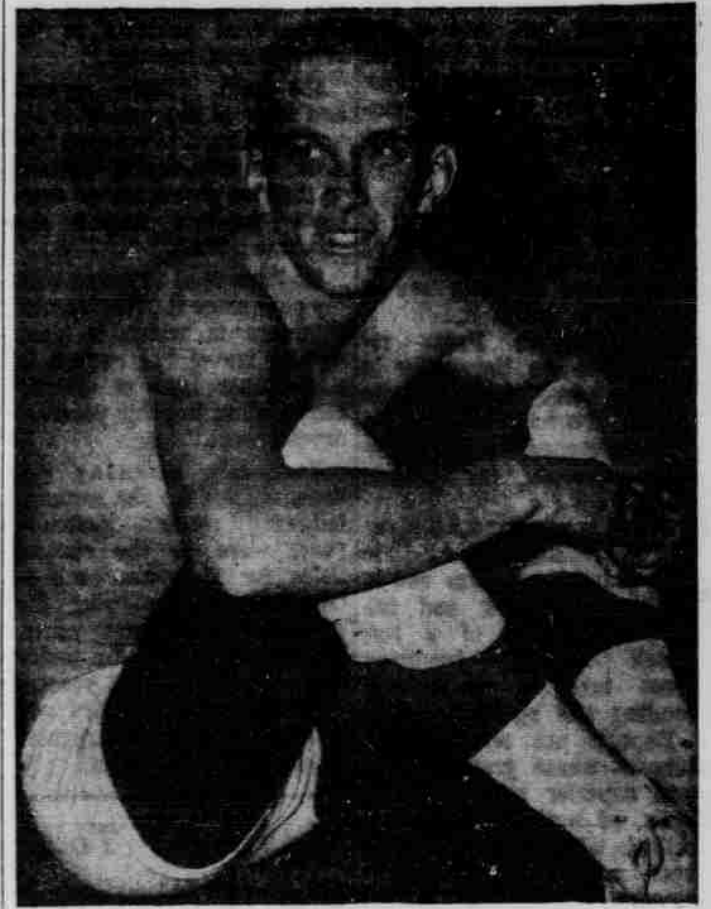
Nebraska Climbs Out Of The Cellar As Loop Race Enters Last Week

The Kansas State Wildcats moved into first place in the Big Eight Conference with a 74-65 licking of Oklahoma State, Monday night. K-State has won nine and lost four Big Eight games and will now be tied with the winner of Tuesday night's Oklahoma-Kansas game at Lawrence. Oklahoma and Kansas were tied for second with 8-4 records going into the game. Mike Wroblewski led Kansas State past Oklahoma State as he scored 26 points. The Wildcats led 34-25 at

Cyclones, back on the track after a bad start in the league, moved into fourth, sporting a 7-6 mark. High man for the Iowans, who led 40-33 at halftime, was Bob Stoy with 18 points. Missouri's Joe Scott hit 21 for the losers. Colorado is fifth in the standings. The Buffs dropped a protested game to Iowa State last week at the Big Eight Faculty Representatives meeting. Sixth place this week belongs to Nebraska. The Huskers are 4-8 in league play but will need at least one more win to insure themselves of a higher finish than a cellar tie. Important games are scheduled for this week beginning with Colorado's Thursday night invasion at Oklahoma. Saturday Colorado is at Oklahoma State and Nebraska visits Kansas State. The latter tilt will have an important bearing on the Wildcats' title hopes.

SHEINWOLD ON BRIDGE Weird Finesse Develops Entry

When you win a trick in dummy you have the right to lead from dummy to the next trick. This right may be far more precious than winning the previous trick.

a high spade you can stay in dummy with the seven of spades and can return to dummy later with the nine of spades. Does this give you any ideas?

Do It Yourself
The right idea is to do it yourself rather than rely on a friendly opponent and a lucky break in diamonds. Trump the third round of hearts with the ten of spades and lead the deuce of spades to finesse dummy's seven! This weird trump finesse does not give you an additional trump trick. It merely gives you an additional entry to the dummy. You arrive in dummy with the seven of spades and you can get back later with the nine.

You use the first entry to lead the king of clubs from dummy. East covers with the ace (if he didn't you would discard a diamond), and you ruff with the jack of spades. Now you get back to dummy with the nine of spades to cash the queen and jack of clubs. This enables you to get rid of two low diamonds, and the contract is assured.

DAILY QUESTION
Partner opens with one club, and the next player passes. You hold: ♠ A K Q J 10 3 2 ♥ 7 3 ♦ A 6 5 3 ♣ None. What do you say?
Answer: Bid two spades. The jump takeout in a new suit forces to game and hints at slam. You don't need support for partner's suit if you have a solid suit of your own. (Copyright 1960, General Features Corp.)
