The three Husker pitchers -Jan Wall, Don Purcell and Dave Webster-combined for 21 strikeouts and allowed the Jackrabbits only five hits.







Declarer next leads the jack of spades from dummy, staying under this with the ten. He is still in dummy and can take a third trump finesse to complete the job of picking up East's
