Council Hears Faculty Ideas For Open House Program

Two tickets to "Ben Hur" and dining for two at Ross Steak House in Omaha are up for grabs as the prize for the winner of the Spring Day Bicycle Race.

Archie Clegg, chairman of Spring Day, told the Student Council at its meeting Wednesday that the 10-mile trial would be the big event of the Spring Day activities.

Clegg also told the Council that preparations for the activities of Spring Day were made and he urged Council members to encourage students in their respective living units to participate in and attend Spring Day.

In other reports heard by the Council, Fred Rickers, chairman of the all-University open house committee, told the council of the recent meeting his committee had with the deans of the colleges and the advisers of the present open house programs.

Rickers listed some of the suggestions that the various

attending faculty members forwarded. These suggestions were: 1) that the committee be aware of a conflict of interests in an All-University Open House program 2) to build around a purpose that is both educational and entertaining 3) to start the event small and build it larger in future years 4) do not eliminate any of the present events and 5) next year, coordinate the present main events.

Rickers told the Council that Dean Breckenridge and Mr. Pittenger recommended that the committee limit the all-University open house program next year by coordinating the present main events, inviting other colleges to have programs on the same days if they desired and by conducting tours.

John Hoerner moved to accept the committee report with the recommendations. Chuck Wilson then told the Council that he was definitely

opposed to starting the all-University open house as a small production since the original motion that set up the committee was that the committee check the possibility and feasibility of holding an all-University open house and then planning toward that goal, regardless of when the production might eventually be held.

The motion to accept the report was tabled.

Ken Tempero, social committee chairman, told the Council that his committee has been meeting in an attempt to obtain suggestions and solutions on the question of "closed nights" concerning various University activities taking place at the same time.
