Only two games separate the first five teams in the Big Eight baseball standings as the teams enter the fifth week of action this weekend. Iowa State and Oklahoma were the only two teams that saw action last weekend as all other games were rained out. The Cyclones and Sooners split a doubleheader with Oklahoma winning 9-7 and Iowa State scoring a 4-3 triumph.

The Sooners dropped a notch in the standings as a result of the twinbill split, with Missouri taking over the third spot.

Oklahoma State is in first place by percentage points over Iowa State with the Tigers in third and Oklahoma in fourth. The Tigers and Sooners are only one game behind the leading Cowboys. Colorado is in fifth place

only two games behind the pacesetters while Nebraska trails by four and Kansas by five. Kansas State is in a familiar position for the Wildcat baseballers, the cellar. The Wildcats are the only team in the loop without a win.

Nebraska Meets Cowboys
This week's action finds Nebraska facing the league-leading Cowboys at Stillwater, Oklahoma at Missouri in a battle for third place and possibly the lead in the standings, Kansas will be at Colorado and Kansas State will travel to Iowa State.

First baseman Ken Rulinger is leading the Husker regulars with a .400 batting average on 12 hits in 30 trips to the plate.

Jerry Harris is leading the team in rbi's with 17 despite an anemic .231 batting average. He is second in home runs with four.

Phil Barth is the home run leader with five. Barth has had only ten hits with five of them being circuit clouts. Harry Tolly has the top

earned run average among the moundmen with a 3.75 mark. Jan Wall is the leading pitcher with three wins against the same number of losses and also leads in strikeouts with 34.

Nebraska Bowlers Grab Fourth in Regional Meet

The University of Nebraska bowling team finished fourth in the Intermountain College Bowling Congress last week end at Boulder, Colo., and the University of Colorado.

The Nebraska team finished behind first place Denver, second place Kansas University and third place Colorado. The final standings were decided on the number of total pins a team had in the five games bowled.

The meet had 43 colleges and universities entered. The Big Eight did well by coping three of the top five places.

The winner, Denver U., represented the East in a meet against the west winner, Utah University, for the national championship this week. The winner, Utah, is now the new ICBC champ.

Each state determines their team by a regional or state meet. This is the first year for the Nebraska entry and only two other schools participated in the state tourney.
