

Nebraska quarterback Pat Fischer and right end Don Purcell have been cited for exceptional performances in Nebraska's win over Texas by the Associated Press' Ail America Nominating Committee for the Midlands area.

In naming the Husker duo, AP said, "Fischer, an in-andouter last season, ran back a punt 76 yards in the second quarter, jabbed two yards in the third and passed for what proved the winning twopoint conversion in leading Nebraska over Texas.

"Purcell was a defensive power in Nebraska's tremendous stand against Texas, especially in the late stages of the game."
