

Huskers Seek Second Win

Minnesota Provides Saturday Opposition

Nebraska will be trying to make it two straight wins when they take on Minnesota at 2 p.m. Saturday at Memorial Stadium in the home opener for the Huskers.

The Huskers have won only two consecutive games on one occasion since Bill Jennings took over the reins in 1957. Nebraska defeated Minnesota, 32-12, and Oregon State, 7-6, on successive Saturdays, a year ago.

Minnesota Opener
Minnesota will be making their first appearance of the season while Nebraska has one game under its belt, a 14-13 upset victory over Texas last Saturday.

The 32 points scored by Nebraska against the Gophers at Minneapolis a year ago was the most for a Nebraska team since the opening game of the 1956 season when Pete Elliott's squad toppled South Dakota, 34-6.

A near capacity crowd of 38,000 to 40,000 may see a high scoring game Saturday with Jennings promising to

open up the Nebraska attack. The Huskers played a waiting game in the victory over Texas.

"We've got to take more chances this week and we'll shoot the works," said the Husker coach who was named coach of the week by United Press International this week. "We can't wait for Minnesota mistakes this time. They gave us a lot of help last year, but there is no reason to believe they will do it again."

The Nebraska attack may be slowed, however, by a practice mishap Wednesday. Sophomore fullback Thunder Thornton jammed his neck and Sophomore end Jim Hoge suffered a torn knee cartilage.

Thornton Ready

Thornton is expected to be ready to go Saturday but he may not be ready to go full speed while Hoge will be out three to four weeks and possibly for the season.

If Thornton isn't ready to go by Saturday, the Huskers could have trouble at the fullback slot since Noel Martin has been hampered by a knee injury.

Hoge's left end job will be handled by Bill Comstock, Dick McDaniel and John Bond. Warren Powers, sophomore halfback is suffering from a sprained ankle but is expected to be ready for the Gophers.

Minnesota leads in the series between the two teams with

28 wins against six for Nebraska. Two games have ended in ties.

A salute to the Big Eight will be the feature of the University Marching Band as they begin their season of half-time performances.

AP Picks Husker Duo

Nebraska quarterback Pat Fischer and right end Don Purcell have been cited for exceptional performances in Nebraska's win over Texas by the Associated Press' All America Nominating Committee for the Midlands area.

In naming the Husker duo, AP said, "Fischer, an in-and-out last season, ran back a punt 76 yards in the second quarter, jabbed two yards in the third and passed for what proved the winning two-point conversion in leading Nebraska over Texas."

"Purcell was a defensive power in Nebraska's tremendous stand against Texas, especially in the late stages of the game."

Other Big Eight players named by AP were John Hadl, Kansas quarterback, and Dany LaRose, Missouri end.
