The constitutional committee will be present at every meeting for consultation and to make changes and revisions.

Neal Ferguson is chairman of the election committee and Winston Wade heads the faculty committee.

The IFC Executive Committee turned down an appeal from Pi Kappa Phi for the initiation of two pledges who made their averages but were not on the house roll last spring.

Also discussed was a proposed reorganization of the IFC system, which will be discussed again next week.
