Nebraska's freshman football team, currently working out under the direction of Jack Braley, includes players from 10 states with 38 players from Nebraska.

The Huskers open the season Nov. 4 when they go against Iowa State's yearlings at Ames. Among the top players recruited from outside Nebraska are:
Lloyd Voss, 6-3, 220-pound all-state end from Magnolia, Minn.
Willie Ross, a 59.9 sprinter from Helena, Ark., who stands 6-0 and weighs 190.
Ed Mitchell of Galveston, Tex., a 6-2, 235-pound tackle.
George Howe of Evergreen Park, Ill., a 6-0, 207 pound guard who won all Catholic honors.
Richard Callahan of Sioux Falls, S.D., an all-state half-back weighing 178 and standing 5-11. He is a 10.3 sprinter.
Lowell Fischer of Kansas City, Mo., 6-0, 220-pound all-state center.
Rudy Johnson of Aransas Pass, Tex., a 10-flat sprinter who was an all-state halfback.
